At the Court at *Buckingham Palace*, the 15th day of August, 1941.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

Whereas there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 30th day of July, 1941 (P.M.2322/41), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Order in Council bearing date the 14th day of October, 1915, it is directed that the Retired Pay or Pension to which Commissioned and Warrant Officers in Your Majesty's Naval and Marine Forces who are called out from the Retired List for further service in war or emergency may be entitled at the date of being called out for further service shall be secured to them, under certain conditions, notwithstanding breaches of discipline or misconduct committed during the said further service:

"And Whereas we consider it desirable that the conditions under which the Retired Pay or Pension of such Officers is secured to them should be modified in certain respects:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to substitute the following directions for those contained in Order in Council bearing date the 14th day of October, 1915, namely:

"That the rates of Retired Pay or Pension to which Commissioned and Warrant Officers in Your Majesty's Naval and Marine Forces may be entitled at the date of being called out for further service shall not be affected by any misconduct during further service, provided that such misconduct be neither:—

(a) Mutiny, nor

(b) Conduct in respect of which a sentence of dismissal from Your Majesty's Service with or without disgrace shall be passed, nor

(c) Conduct of such a nature as to lead to the Officer's name being removed from the list of Officers, or to the Officer being allowed to resign his Commission or Warrant to avoid trial by Court Martial;

but nothing in this Order in Council shall affect the discretionary powers of the Admiralty of forfeiture, suspension and restoration conferred by Orders in Council dated the 20th November, 1905, and the 7th February, 1921, in so far as such powers relate to periods of imprisonment.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 30th day of July, 1941 (P.M. 2322/41), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force, to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Order in Council bearing date the 25th day of July, 1927, we are empowered to place on the Retired List Officers of Your Majesty's Naval and Marine Forces who, in our opinion, have become unfit for or unworthy of further employment by reason of an act or acts of misconduct or through intemperate or irregular habits of life; and to grant to such officers such rates of retired pay or such gratuity as we think fit within the limits prescribed in the said Order in Council:

"And whereas by Order in Council bearing date the 21st day of April, 1922, we are empowered to place on the Retired List Officers of Your Majesty's Naval and Marine Forces who are judged by us to be unfit for further employment by reason of incapacity or peculiarity of temper or other defect not amounting to misconduct and not caused by intemperate or irregular habits of life; and with the consent of the Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury to make appropriate provision for the grant of retired pay or gratuity to such Officers:

"And whereas by various subsequent Orders in Council scales of retired pay and gratuity have been established for Officers who have been retired under Order in Council of the 21st day of April, 1922:

"And whereas we consider that it is desirable that we should also be empowered to place on the Retired List Officers of Your Majesty's Naval and Marine Forces who may be judged by us to be unsuitable for further service by reason of incapacity, inefficiency, unsatisfactory performance of duties or other defect, such unsuitability being held by us to be due to causes within their own control but not to be of such a nature as to justify retirement under the provisions of the aforesaid Order in Council dated the 25th day of July, 1927: and, further, to make appropriate provision for the award of retired pay or gratuity to such Officers:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council, to sanction the Regulations in the Schedule annexed hereto.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal.

" SCHEDULE.

"1. An Officer who, in the opinion of the Admiralty, is unsuitable for further service by reason of incapacity, inefficiency, unsatisfactory performance of duties or other defect, such unsuitability being held by the Admiralty to be due to causes within his own control but not to be of such a nature as to justify retirement under Order in Council of 25th July, 1927, or subsequent Order in Council providing for retirement for misconduct, may be placed on the retired list, irrespective of age or service.

"2. An Officer placed on the retired list under Clause 1 may be granted such rate of retired pay or such gratuity within the scale provided for an Officer of such rank and service who is placed on the retired list under Order in Council of 21st April, 1922, as the Admiralty, in their discretion, may think fit having regard to the circumstances attending the retirement; and further, the Admiralty may, at their discretion, award a gratuity of such amount as they think fit instead of retired pay, subject to the conditions of Clause 3 of this Schedule.

"3. A gratuity shall not be awarded instead of retired pay to an Officer who would have been eligible for retired pay had he been permitted to retire voluntarily. The amount of a gratuity awarded instead of retired pay shall be within the commutation value, calculated according to the current table in use by the Pensions Commutation Board for the commutation of Officers' retired pay, of the retired pay which would have been payable had the Officer retired under Order in Council of 21st April, 1922."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 31st day of July, 1941, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Reverend Alfred, Bishop of Bradford (in witness whereof he has signed the Scheme), for effecting the union of the Benefice of Ingleton, and the Benefice of Chapel-le-Dale, both situate in the Diocese of Bradford:—

" SCHEME.

"1. *Union of Benefices.*—The Benefice of Ingleton and the Benefice of Chapel-le-Dale

shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Ingleton with Chapel-le-Dale' but the parishes of the said benefices shall continue in all respects distinct.

"2. *Taking effect of union.*—Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the Reverend Gordon Charles Ashbee, if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Ingleton, shall with his consent (testified by his signature hereto), be the first incumbent of the united benefice.

"3. *Parsonage House.*—Upon the union taking effect the parsonage house at present belonging to the Benefice of Ingleton shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice.

"4. *Patronage.*—After the union has taken effect the right of presentation to the united benefice shall be exercised by the Bishop of Bradford in whom, in right of his See, the patronage of each of the two benefices is vested."

And whereas the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, and the Union of Benefices Rules, 1926 to 1930, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that it shall be and become effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette.

Whereas the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the 3rd day of April, 1941, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for effecting the unions (1) of the benefice of Knockin and of certain parts (known as Maesbrook and Osbaston) of the benefice of Kinnerley and (2) of the remaining part of the said benefice of Kinnerley with the benefice of Melverley, all of which benefices are situate in the County of Salop and in the Diocese of Lichfield:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Edward Sydney, Bishop of Lichfield, pursuant to the provisions of the said Measures to inquire into and report upon the re-arrangement by way of union of the said benefices of Knockin, Kinnerley and Melverley duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Lichfield and therein recommended the unions hereinbefore mentioned and the

terms for effecting such unions and the said Bishop of Lichfield signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this scheme for the said unions of benefices which scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report but with the assent of the said Bishop of Lichfield embodies certain modifications thereof:

"And whereas the said benefice of Kinnerley is now full the Reverend Alfred Jones being the present incumbent thereof and the said benefices of Knockin and Melverley are at present vacant:

"And whereas the patronage of the said benefice of Knockin and of the said benefice of Kinnerley belongs to one and the same Patron:

"And whereas a Fund is held by certain Trustees upon trust to pay the income thereof to the clergyman serving the Church at Maesbrook or for certain other purposes in connection with the same Church:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consents of the said Edward Sydney, Bishop of Lichfield, and of the said Alfred Jones (in testimony whereof they have signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

1. That the parts of the said benefice of Kinnerley which are known as Maesbrook and Osbaston (the boundary of which parts, taken together, is shown by a red verge line on the map annexed to this scheme) shall be severed from that benefice and shall be permanently united to the said benefice of Knockin and shall form one benefice with cure of souls (and one parish for ecclesiastical purposes) under the style of 'The benefice of Knockin with Maesbrook.'

2. That the Church of the parish of Knockin shall be the parish church of the parish of Knockin with Maesbrook and that the table of fees for the said parish of Knockin shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the table of fees for the said parish.

3. That the remaining part of the said benefice of Kinnerley and the said benefice of Melverley shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The united benefice of Kinnerley with Melverley' but the parishes of Kinnerley and Melverley shall continue distinct in all respects.

4. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the unions shall forthwith take effect and the said Alfred Jones if he is then incumbent of the said benefice of Kinnerley shall be the first incumbent of the united benefice of Kinnerley with Melverley.

5. That upon the said unions taking effect (a) the endowments and property of the said benefice of Kinnerley shall belong wholly to the united benefice of Kinnerley with Melverley, and the parsonage house at Kinnerley shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice of Kinnerley with Melverley; and (b) the parsonage house at Knockin shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the benefice of Knockin with Maesbrook.

6. That after the said unions have taken effect (1) the patronage of the benefice of Knockin with Maesbrook shall belong wholly

to the patron of the said benefice of Knockin and (2) the course and succession in which the respective patrons shall present or nominate to the united benefice of Kinnerley with Meverley from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, that in every series of three successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to the united benefice after the union the patron of the said benefice of Meverley shall have the first turn and the patron of the said benefice of Kinnerley shall have the second and third turns."

And whereas the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, and the Union of Benefices Rules, 1926 to 1930, relating to the preparation and submission of this scheme have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said scheme and to order that it shall be and become effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette.

ACQUISITION OF SECURITIES.

Treasury Directions.

The Treasury, in pursuance of paragraph (2) of Regulation 1 of the Defence (Finance) Regulations, 1939, have, by the Acquisition of Securities (No. 4) Order, 1941, transferred to themselves certain securities as specified in that Order.

(b) in the case of Stock Certificates to Bearer: the Stock Certificates to Bearer accompanied by all coupons belonging thereto maturing on or after the 16th August, 1941, together with a form "B" completed as to Section 1 only.

2. Payment shall be made on the 6th October, 1941, to the bank stockbroker or other person through whom the securities are delivered provided that delivery of the requisite documents, complete and in order, has been made to the Bank of England on or before the 15th September, 1941. Payment for securities delivered thereafter will be made three weeks after delivery of the requisite documents complete and in order.

3. The Bank of Ireland, Belfast, and any branch in the Isle of Man of Barclays Bank Limited, Lloyds Bank Limited, Martins Bank Limited or Westminster Bank Limited, shall be Receiving Banks for the purpose of this Direction.

ROYAL AIR FORCE.

The KING has been graciously pleased to approve the following awards in recognition of gallantry displayed in flying operations against the enemy:—

Distinguished Flying Cross.

Acting Flight Lieutenant Francis David Stephen SCOTT-MALDEN (74690), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 603 Squadron.

This officer has been continuously engaged in operational flying since June, 1940, leading his flight and sometimes the squadron. During the last six weeks, he has taken part in 38 offensive operations over enemy territory. A fine leader, Flight Lieutenant Scott-Malden has at all times displayed great keenness and determination in his engagements with the enemy. He has destroyed three and damaged many of their aircraft.

Flying Officer Frances Evelyn George RASHLEIGH (41064), No. 202 Squadron.

One evening in July, 1941, following a report that one of our aircraft had crashed on the French Moroccan coast, Flying Officer Rashleigh took off to locate the aircraft and render assistance. Sighting the wrecked aircraft at Sidi Dilemie, he flew low over the spot three or four times and observed four groups comprising some two hundred Arabs. While making another circuit, the three members of the crew of the wrecked aircraft detached themselves from the largest group and commenced waving. Flying Officer Rashleigh indicated that he would land near where they were standing—on the edge of a small undulation. Coming to ground on the shallow side of the rise, out of view of the

majority of the Arabs, he finished his run to within thirty yards of the crew who immediately dashed for the aircraft. The Arabs then opened fire and Flying Officer Rashleigh, with the crew scrambling aboard, immediately turned the tail of his aircraft towards the hostile party and opened the throttle causing a cloud of dust which obscured them from view. He then took off safely and returned to base with the rescued crew. This officer showed great skill and initiative throughout a daring exploit.

Pilot Officer Herbert Scott SEWELL (86667), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 54 Squadron.

This officer has participated in most of the operational sweeps carried out by the squadron. He has displayed great keenness to engage the enemy and has destroyed at least four of their aircraft. Pilot Officer Sewell has set a very fine example.

Distinguished Flying Medal.

906496 Sergeant Peter Alec TANTON, No. 15 Squadron.

In July, 1941, this officer was the captain of an aircraft which participated in a daylight attack on a factory at Lille. On the approach to the target, the outer starboard engine of his aircraft was hit by anti-aircraft fire. Sergeant Tanton continued his run and dropped his bombs with the formation but later became separated. When nearing the French coast Sergeant Tanton's aircraft was attacked by an enemy fighter who slightly wounded the rear gunner and holed the starboard petrol tank. The inner starboard engine now failed owing to lack of fuel. In spite of these great hardships Sergeant Tanton coolly and skilfully enabled his rear gunner to engage and shoot down the attacker. Sergeant Tanton then flew on to a home base where he decided to land. With only the two port engines functioning, the aircraft would not maintain flying speed with the undercarriage or flaps lowered but, with exceptional skill and judgment, the undercarriage was put down a moment before impact with the ground and a remarkable landing was effected without further damage to the aircraft. This captain of aircraft displayed splendid skill and coolness throughout and was mainly responsible for the safe return of his aircraft and crew.

532737 Sergeant Victor Clement CORDERY.

747865 Sergeant George Cyril STARKEY, Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve (missing).

In April, 1941, Sergeants Cordery and Starkey were members of the crew of an aircraft which, whilst at its moorings, was attacked by a formation of seven Junkers 87's flying in line astern. When the leading pilot

dived to make a front gun attack; Sergeants Cordery and Starkey coolly withheld their fire until the enemy was in close range and continued these tactics against the remainder; who attacked at short intervals. During the action, the aircraft was repeatedly hit about the wings, midship section and free gunner's position, and on the third attack the inner tanks caught fire and the aircraft rapidly became a mass of flames. Nevertheless Sergeants Cordery and Starkey remained at their posts and kept up their fire during the seven attacks, and destroyed one of the enemy aircraft and hit others. It was not until further action was impossible that Sergeants Cordery and Starkey left their posts. They were last to leave and the aircraft sank five minutes later. Both airmen displayed great courage and devotion to duty throughout.

520175 Sergeant Edgar William Henry ZIETHING.

In May, 1941, Sergeants Thynne and Ziething were, respectively, air gunner and observer in an aircraft which carried out an attack on a fort at Rutbah. After the attack Sergeant Thynne drew the attention of his pilot to an aircraft burning on the ground. A figure waving was seen to be beside the aircraft. The pilot landed alongside and Sergeant Ziething, who jumped out before the aircraft had completely stopped, went to rescue the survivor. Meanwhile, Sergeant Thynne went to the burning wreckage, where Sergeant Ziething shortly joined him and, in the face of enemy fire from armoured cars and despite ammunition exploding in all directions, both airmen searched the wreckage in an attempt to discover the remainder of the crew. Unable to find any traces of them, Sergeants Thynne and Ziething returned to their own aircraft which flew off with the rescued officer on board. Both these airmen displayed great courage and complete disregard for their own safety.

550781 Corporal George Eric BANFIELD.

During the intensive bombardment prior to and during the enemy invasion of Crete, when telephone communication had been destroyed, Corporal Banfield maintained contact by wireless telegraphy between the station and operations room at Heraklion. For over three days he continued to pass vital information, whilst working in a tent without protection from machine gun fire and bombing. Later, when the unit of some 50 Royal Air Force personnel, mainly untrained in fighting, were cut off from the defended area at Heraklion and it became necessary to fight a way through German forces, Corporal Banfield displayed conspicuous bravery and was always the first to volunteer for any difficult or dangerous task. On two occasions he led small parties in out-flanking enemy posts which were keeping the main body under fire, destroying their posts and capturing prisoners. When the main body were unable to enter our own lines, as our troops failed to recognise them, Corporal Banfield was the first to volunteer for a small party which succeeded in getting through and warning our troops of the approach of

the main body. Corporal Banfield, by his courageous efforts, contributed materially to the ability of the unit to fight its way through a numerically superior enemy force.
