The KING has been graciously pleased to approve the following awards in recognition of gallantry displayed in flying operations against the enemy:—

Distinguished Flying Cross.

Acting Squadron Leader Joseph Shaw KENNEDY (81351), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 226 Squadron.

This officer has completed twenty operational sorties in daylight with damaging results. In June, 1941, he carried out a very successful low-level attack on railway yards south of Oldenburg causing great damage to rolling stock. Some time afterwards he participated in a raid on Nordeney. After bombing he attacked gun emplacements on the coast with machine-gun fire. In an attack on shipping in July, 1941, Squadron Leader Kennedy, flying at a height of only 50 feet, bombed and destroyed an 8,000 ton merchant vessel. In August, 1941, he participated in an attack on enemy shipping off the Dutch coast. In the face of intense anti-aircraft fire, he pressed home his attack from about 50 feet and destroyed a 4,000 ton merchant vessel. Squadron Leader Kennedy has displayed great leadership, courage and devotion to duty.

Acting Squadron Leader Arthur Deane NESBITT (C1327), Royal Canadian Air Force, No. 401 Squadron.

This officer has displayed fine leadership and exceptional devotion to duty throughout a long period of active operations against the enemy. On a particular occasion in December, 1940, Squadron Leader Nesbitt led a section of aircraft over the sea for two hours without wireless assistance in extremely adverse weather conditions; visibility was practically nil. His judgment enabled the section eventually to land safely, although their petrol was practically exhausted, without loss to personnel. Squadron Leader Nesbitt has destroyed two enemy aircraft.

Acting Squadron Leader James Herbert THOMPSON (70671), Reserve of Air Force Officers, No. 269 Squadron.

Flying Officer William John Oswald COLEMAN (42395), No. 269 Squadron.

Squadron Leader Thompson and Flying Officer Coleman, were pilot and navigator bomb aimer respectively of an aircraft in which they carried out a successful attack on an enemy submarine. In very poor weather conditions, Flying Officer Coleman skilfully navigated to the position and, co-operating splendidly with his pilot, attacked with such good effect that the submarine surfaced. When Squadron Leader Thompson opened fire with his machine guns, the submarine crew waved a white flag. One of His Majesty's destroyers later took charge of the submarine. The success of the operation was undoubtedly due to the splendid teamwork of these two officers. Both Squadron Leader Thompson and Flying Officer Coleman have previously carried out numerous operational missions.

Flying Officer Edward Arthur JEWISS (44261), No. 209 Squadron.

Flying Officer Jewiss has been an exceptionally sound and capable operational pilot particularly in connection with attacks on enemy submarines. Whilst on patrol recently Flying Officer Jewiss was instructed to make contact with an enemy submarine lying disabled on the surface of the sea. Accomplishing this, he then flew over the position in unfavourable weather conditions for a further ten hours, meanwhile skilfully co-operating, throughout the hours of darkness, with a naval vessel. Both these operations were performed in unfavourable flying conditions.

Pilot Officer David Usher BARNWELL (61052), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 185 Squadron.

This officer has displayed outstanding courage and determination when attacking hostile aircraft of which he has destroyed at least four by night. He has in every way set an excellent example.

Distinguished Flying Medal.

527384 Flight Sergeant Norman Frederick Temple GOLDSMITH, No. 90 Squadron.

In August, 1941, this airman was fire controller of a Fortress aircraft which was attacked by seven enemy fighters when returning from a bombing attack on the docks at Brest. Twenty-six separate attacks were made against the Fortress within twenty-three minutes. In the early attacks the lower and beam gunners of our aircraft were killed and, in the absence of return fire, the aircraft was repeatedly hit at point blank range. Flight Sergeant Goldsmith was himself wounded in the leg in one of the early attacks but, through the whole engagement, gave valuable assistance to his pilots by indicating the necessary avoiding action. His success in this direction was largely responsible for the fact that, when the attackers finally flew off, the aircraft was still flying and the two pilots and navigator were unhurt. To ascertain the fate of the air gunners at the rear of the bomb compartment, it would have been necessary to cross the gangway through the compartment. With the bomb doors open, the guide ropes shot away and the narrow gangway itself covered with tangled wiring, the crossing would have been hazardous in the extreme. Nevertheless, Flight Sergeant Goldsmith, with one leg almost useless, had to be restrained by force from attempting it.

This airman has participated in twenty operational sorties over enemy-occupied territory and has destroyed at least four hostile aircraft. He has at all times shown great keenness and courage.
