A PROCLAMATION.

Specifying the articles to be treated as Contraband of War in the War with Bulgaria.

GEORGE, R.I.

Whereas a state of War exists between Us and Bulgaria:

And whereas it is necessary to specify the articles which it is Our intention to treat as Contraband of War:

Now, therefore, We do hereby Declare, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, that during the continuance of the War, or until We do give further public notice, the Proclamation issued on September 3rd, 1939, wherein were specified the articles which it is Our intention to treat as Contraband of War during the continuance of the War with Germany, shall be deemed to specify the articles which it is Our intention to treat as Contraband of War during the continuance of the War with Bulgaria.

Given at Our Court at Buckingham Palace, this Twenty-second day of January, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and forty-two and in the Sixth year of Our Reign.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 9th day of January, 1942 (N.182/1942), in the words following, viz.:—

“Whereas by section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted *inter alia* that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas by Orders in Council dated 19th July, 1910, 25th May, 1922, and 12th June, 1941, sanction was given to the grant of a Special Allowance of *rs.* a day to the Senior Writers employed in the Offices of the Commanders-in-Chief of Your Majesty's Ships and Vessels at the three Home Ports, in the Home Fleet, and in the Offices of the Commanders-in-Chief, Mediterranean and Western Approaches:

“And whereas we are of opinion that for the period of hostilities the duties and responsibilities devolving upon the Senior Writer in the Office of the Commander-in-Chief, Rosyth, merit the grant of a special allowance:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the grant of an allowance of *rs.* a day to the Senior Writer in the Office of the Commander-in-Chief, Rosyth, with effect from the 9th November, 1941, and further to sanction the grant of a similar allowance at our discretion in any other instances arising during the period of hostilities which we may regard as comparable, particularly as regards the size of the Office Staff, with those in which the allowance is already paid.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

“And whereas by Order in Council bearing date the 26th day of October, 1899, this allowance was increased to *3s. 6d.* an hour:

“And whereas it has now been found necessary to train and qualify divers in other ships and establishments where expert divers are borne:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the payment of a similar allowance of *3s. 6d.* an hour to the Gunner in charge of diving instruction in any ship or establishment, when actually employed under water, with effect from the date of commencing such duties.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS a state of war exists between His Majesty and Finland, Hungary, Roumania and Bulgaria, who are conducting the war against His Majesty as allies of Germany and Italy:

And whereas Finland, Hungary, Roumania and Bulgaria, by associating themselves with Germany and Italy in the present war, have made themselves parties to the method of waging war adopted by Germany and Italy, and share in any advantages derived therefrom:

And whereas the commerce of Finland, Hungary, Roumania and Bulgaria is, equally with that of Germany and Italy, employed to further the common cause of the enemies of His Majesty:

And whereas these facts give to His Majesty an unquestionable right to apply to the commerce of Finland, Hungary, Roumania and Bulgaria measures similar to those taken against that of Germany and Italy:

And whereas by Orders in Council dated the 27th day of November, 1939, the 11th day of June, 1940, and the 17th and 31st days of July, 1940, His Majesty was pleased to direct certain measures to be taken against German and Italian commerce as an act of retaliation against the illegal acts referred to in the said Orders:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

Subject to the substitution, in the case of Finland, Hungary and Roumania, of the 6th day of December, 1941, and, in the case of Bulgaria, of the 13th day of December, 1941, for the 4th day of December, 1939, in articles 1 and 2 of the Order in Council dated the 27th day of November, 1939, the said Order and the Orders in Council dated the 17th and 31st days of July, 1940, shall apply for restricting the commerce of Finland, Hungary, Roumania and Bulgaria in the same manner as they apply for restricting that of Germany and Italy.

Whereas by virtue of the powers conferred upon Him by Section 9 of the Weights and Measures Act, 1904 (4 Edw. 7. c. 28), His Majesty was pleased by Order in Council dated the 12th day of January, 1905 (S.R. & O. 1905, No. 11) (hereinafter called "the principal Order") to specify new fees to be paid in respect of the verification and stamping of weights, measures and weighing and measuring instruments in substitution for the fees specified in the First Schedule to the Weights and Measures Act, 1889 (52 & 53 Vict. c. 21):

And whereas the Principal Order has been varied from time to time by divers subsequent Orders in Council made by virtue of the aforesaid powers of His Majesty and the provisions of subsection (2) of Section 3 of the Weights and Measures (Amendment) Act, 1926 (16 & 17 Geo. 5, c. 8):

And whereas the Board of Trade have represented to His Majesty that it would be expedient further to vary the Principal Order and to specify new fees to be paid on the verification and stamping of weighing machines used or intended for use for grading eggs by weight:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the powers vested in Him as aforesaid and of all other powers enabling Him in that behalf, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Weights and Measures (Verification and Stamping Fees) Order,

1942, and shall come into force on the 22nd day of January, 1942.

2. The fees specified in the Schedule hereto shall be paid in respect of the verification and stamping of the weighing instruments mentioned in the said Schedule.

3. The fees specified in the Schedule hereto shall likewise be paid in respect of any weighing instrument mentioned in the said Schedule which on verification is found to be incorrect or defective.

Weighing instruments used or intended for use for grading eggs by weight.

1. Each instrument embodying a single weighing unit—

(a) When verified and stamped at the Inspector's office 6d.

(b) when verified and stamped at any other place an additional fee of 5s. for each instrument tested shall be payable.

2. Each instrument embodying more than one weighing unit—

(a) When verified and stamped at the Inspector's office—for each weighing unit ... 6d.

(b) when verified and stamped at any other place an additional fee of 5s. for each instrument tested shall be payable.

3. Notwithstanding the foregoing, when more than two instruments are submitted for verification and stamping on the same occasion, at some place other than the Inspector's office, the total amount of additional fees payable in respect of all the instruments so submitted shall not exceed 15s.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 48th and 49th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, and of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners Measure, 1926, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 11th day of December, 1941, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 48th and 49th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, and of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners Measure, 1926, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for augmenting the income of the Archdeaconry of Ely in the Diocese of Ely:

"Whereas it appears to us to be desirable that the income of the said Archdeaconry of Ely should be augmented in the manner which is hereinafter recommended and proposed:

"And whereas the grant hereinafter recommended and proposed will not have the effect of raising the annual income provided for such Archdeaconry out of the Common Fund created by the said Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, beyond the sum of £300 and will not raise the whole income of the said Archdeaconry beyond the sum of £1,000 per annum:

"Now, therefore, we, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners, with the consent of the Right Reverend Edward, Bishop of Ely, (testified by his having signed and sealed this Scheme) humbly recommend and propose that, subject as is hereinafter mentioned, we be authorised to pay out of the said Common Fund by equal quarterly payments on the first day of January, the first day of April, the first day of July, and the first day of October in every year to the Archdeacon of the said Archdeaconry of Ely and to his successors in the same Archdeaconry a yearly sum of £300, to take effect and be calculated as from the 1st day of January, 1942. Provided always that before any payment in respect of the said yearly sum shall be made by us we shall require to be satisfied that the said Archdeacon has during the previous twelve calendar months complied with the conditions as to residence which for the time being are required by law.

" And we further recommend and propose that procurations, synodals, visitation fees and induction fees or any of these fees or payments shall no longer be receivable by the Archdeacon of the said Archdeaconry, and all such fees or payments shall accordingly cease to be payable to the said Archdeacon.

" And we further recommend and propose that whenever any Archdeacon who may be entitled to receive the said yearly sum of £300 hereinbefore recommended to be paid to the said Archdeacon of Ely shall resign or otherwise avoid his Archdeaconry, such yearly sum shall be apportionable between such Archdeacon or his representatives (as the case may be) and the Archdeacon who shall next be collated to the same Archdeaconry."

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Ely.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Reverend Bertram, Bishop of Norwich (in witness whereof he has signed the Scheme), for effecting the unions (1) of the Benefice of Baconsthorpe with a part, namely Plumstead, of the Benefice of Plumstead with Matlask and (2) of the Benefice of Barningham Winter (otherwise Barningham Town), the Benefice of Barningham Norwood (otherwise Barningham North) and the remaining part, namely Matlask, of the said Benefice of Plumstead with Matlask, all of which benefices are situate in the County of Norfolk and Diocese of Norwich:

" SCHEME.

PART I.

Baconsthorpe and Plumstead.

1. *Union of Benefices.*—The Benefice of Baconsthorpe and a part, namely Plumstead, of the Benefice of Plumstead with Matlask, shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Baconsthorpe with Plumstead' and the united benefice shall be included in the rural deanery of Holt but the parishes of the said benefices shall continue in all respects distinct.

2. *Taking effect of union.*—Upon the day when any Order in Council affirming this Scheme is gazetted the union shall forthwith take effect and the Reverend William Lievesley Stock if he is then the Incumbent of the Benefice of Baconsthorpe shall with his consent (testified by his signature hereto) be the first Incumbent of the united benefice.

3. *Parsonage House.*—Upon the union taking effect the parsonage house at present belonging to the Benefice of Baconsthorpe shall be the house of residence of the Incumbent of the united benefice.

4. *Endowments.*—Upon the union taking effect all that part of the endowments and property of the Benefice of Plumstead with Matlask which before the union of Plumstead and Matlask belonged to the Benefice of Plumstead or represents the proceeds of the sale or redemption of any of such part shall belong to the united Benefice of Baconsthorpe with Plumstead.

5. *Patronage.*—After the union has taken effect the right of presentation to the united benefice shall be exercised by the patrons of the two benefices alternately, the patron of the Benefice of Plumstead with Matlask having the first presentation to the united benefice to be made after the union.

PART II.

Barningham Winter, Barningham Norwood and Matlask.

1. *Union of Benefices.*—The Benefice of Barningham Winter, the Benefice of Barningham Norwood and the remaining part, namely Matlask, of the Benefice of Plumstead with Matlask shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Barningham with Matlask'.

2. *Union of Parishes.*—The Parish of Barningham Winter and the Parish of Barningham Norwood shall be united together and form one parish for ecclesiastical purposes under the style of 'The United Parish of Barningham Winter with Barningham Norwood'. The Parish of Matlask shall continue in all respects a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes.

3. *Parish Church.*—The parish church of the Parish of Barningham Winter shall be the parish church of the united Parish of Barningham Winter with Barningham Norwood.

4. *Taking effect of union.*—Upon the day when any Order in Council affirming this Scheme is gazetted the union shall forthwith take effect and the Reverend Cyril Wilson if he is then the Incumbent of the Benefices of Barningham Winter and Barningham Norwood shall with his consent (testified

by his signature hereto) be the first Incumbent of the united benefice.

5. *Registers.*—Upon the union taking effect the marriage registers in duplicate current at the Church of Barningham Norwood shall be sent by the Incumbent of the united benefice to the Registrar-General to be closed officially.

6. *Parsonage House.*—Upon the union taking effect the parsonage house at present belonging to the Benefice of Barningham Winter shall be the house of residence of the Incumbent of the united benefice.

7. *Endowments.*—Upon the union taking effect the endowments and property of the Benefice of Plumstead with Matlask, other than the part mentioned in clause 4 of Part I of this Scheme, shall belong to the united Benefice of Barningham with Matlask.

8. *Patronage.*—After the union has taken effect the right of presentation to the united benefice shall be exercised in turn by the patrons of the three benefices, the patron of the Benefice of Barningham Norwood having the first presentation to the united benefice to be made after the union, the patron of the Benefice of Barningham Winter having the second turn and the patron of the Benefice of Plumstead with Matlask having the third turn."

And whereas the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, and the Union of Benefices Rules, 1926 to 1930, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme, and to order that it shall be and become effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the *London Gazette*.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday the 30th *January*, 1942, at 1 p.m., for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the National Loans Acts, 1939 to 1941, to the amount of £60,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £50,000 or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 2nd *February*, 1942, to Saturday, the 7th *February*, 1942, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday 12 noon) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.
