Flying a badly damaged aircraft, on a dark moonless night, and with no instruments to aid him, Sergeant Farrow eventually reached this country where he made a safe landing with the under-carriage retracted. By his skill and resolution, he saved both his aircraft and, unknowingly, his wounded crew. This airman has participated in many operational missions and has always shown courage and tenacity worthy of high praise. worthy of high praise.

One night in January, 1942, Sergeants Briggs and Pepper were wireless operator and flight engineer respectively of an aircraft which carried out a successful operation against Munster. On leaving the target area, the aircraft was caught in a belt of searchlights and attacked by enemy fighters. During the first attack Sergeant Briggs was wounded in the leg. Despite considerable pain and loss of blood, he coolly continued his wireless duties until the aircraft reached this country. Sergeant Pepper was wounded in the hand and knee but he bravely made his way to the astro-dome, where, although suffering much the astro-dome, where, although suffering much pain, he rendered most valuable assistance to his pilot by directing the necessary avoiding action through a succession of attacks. He thus played great part in the safe return of the aircraft to this country.
