Rome, Dec. 5. N. S.

HE Pope is at present somewhat better, his Feaver being abated, however his Recovery, by reason of his great Age, is still much doubted; And there being no manner of likelihood that he can be in a condition to go abroad at the opening of the Jubilee, he has already named Cardinal Barberini to perform the Ceremony of opening St. Peter's Gate, and intends for this purpose to give him the Character of his Legate à Latere; But if the Pope should die before Christmass Eve, the Jubilee must then be put off till a new Pope is chosen. The Prince of Manate, Ambassador from France, is fallen ill of a very violent Feaver. A Sum of 5000 Crowns has by the Pope's Order been paid out of his Treasury to Signior Ferdinando, who has the Care of the new Buildings at Port Anzo, to be employed in repairing the Damages they have lately

fusianed there by the breaking in of the Sea.

Genous, Dec. 5. The Gallies of Tursis, which brought from Barcelona the Duke d'Uçeda Ambassador of spain to the Pope, having been forced into Villa Franca by stress of Weather, his Excellency came from thence in a Felucca, and arrived here the 29th past; He sent a Courier to the Prince of Vaudemont to give him notice of his arrival, and on the 2d Instant his Excellency set out for Milan to make that Prince a Visit, after

which he will proceed on his Journey to Rome. Venice, Dec. 11. The Senate have appointed Signior Francisco Grimani, who has at prefent the Chief Command of their Forces in the Morea, to be Proveditore-General of Dalmatia, and has chosen Signior Delfino, Lieutenant-General of the Isles, to be General of the Venetian Forces in the Morea. The Duke of Mantua is still here, and it's believed he will put off his Journey to Rome, unless the Pope recovers. Our last Letters from Dalmatis give an Account, that the Venetian and Turkith Commissioners continued their Conferences at Castelnovo for settling the Limits, and in all appearance will quite finish this Business in a short time. The Ship called the Leeds Gal-

ley arrived here this day from England.
Copenhagen, Dec. 19. The day is not yet fixed for the King of Denmark's departure for Holstein, but part of his Servants are already fent away, and those who are to attend him in his Journey, are commanded to be ready on the first Orders they shall receive. A Courier arrived here this week from the King's Minister at the Court of Smeden, who was immediately fent back again with an answer to the Dispatches he brought.
A large Man of War was Launched here yesterday, and Orders are given for building three more with all possible diligence. The new Levies for reinforcing the Danish Regiments and

Vienna, Decemb. 12. The young Princes, Daughter to the King of the Romans, was Christned the 9th Instant, and named Maria-Josepha-Benedictina-Antonia-Zaviera-Philippina. Count de Harrach, High Steward to the Emperor, is very much Indisposed. Count Lemberg, Ambassador from this Court to the Pope, has fent away his Equipage, and intends himfelf to fer out from hence very speedily on his Journey to Rome. An Express is come hither from Count Marsigly the Imperial Commissioner for fettling the Limits, with an Account, that the Turks propose, in order to adjust the Matter in dispute about the Town of Novi, that the faid Town and all its Dependences on this fide the River Unna shall be left to the Emperor, and all the Land belonging to it on the other fide the said River to the Grand Signior, provided the Germans will demolish the new Fortrels of Unna, but this last Condition the Court feems unwilling to confent to. Our Letters from Peterwaradin bring Advice, that Count Oting, the Emperor's Ambassador to the Grand Signior, went from thence on the 5th Instant with Count Guido of Staremberg, the Baron of Nehm Governor of Peterwaradin, and divers other Persons of Quality, to Salankemen, near which Town a Place was marked out for his Excellency's meeting the Turkish Ambassador, which was to be performed the 7th with a great deal of Formality.

Berlin, Dec. 12. The Baron of Plettemberg, Brother to the Bishop of Munster, came hither the 7th Instant from Munster, and has since had a Private Audience of the Elector of Branden-The Sieur Artamenowitz, Ambassador from the Czar of Muscovy to the States-General, arrived here last week from Moscow; On the 7th Instant he had Audience of the Elector of Brandenburgh; He and his Retinue were splendidly entertained during their stay at this Place by his Electoral Highnes's Order, and yesterday he left this Place, and continued his Journey to Holland.

Hamburgh, Dec. 22. Major General Scholz and divers other Danish Officers are arrived from Co-Major General Scholz and penhagèn in the Neighbourhood of this Place, and have taken their Quarters at Altenos, where the Duke of Wirtemberg is daily expected from Renf-bourg, to review the Danish Forces Quartered in these Parts.
