"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, Chapter 77, of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, and of the Act of the 37th and 38th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 63, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme with respect to some of the Rural Deaneries within the Archdeaconry of Doncaster and the Archdeaconry of Sheffield, both in the Diocese of Sheffield:

"Whereas it has been represented to us by the Right Reverend Leslie, Bishop of Sheffield, that the arrangements which are hereinafter recommended and proposed with respect to some of the Rural Deaneries within the said Archdeaconries of Doncaster and Sheffield are desirable and should be carried into effect and we are of opinion that the same may be properly carried into effect:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Leslie, Bishop of Sheffield (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and Episcopal Seal to this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that as from the day on which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette, and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, first, the Parishes of Elsecar; (St. Peter) Nether Hoyland; St. Andrew, Nether Hoyland; Worsborough; St. James, Worsborough Bridge; St. Luke, Worsborough Common, and St. Thomas, Worsborough Dale, shall be transferred from the said Archdeaconry of
