PRESENT,

The KING'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 14th day of January, 1943, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

following, that is to say:— "We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called 'the said Benefice') of Madehurst in the County of Sussex and Diocese of Chichester: Chichester:

"Whereas we are satisfied that J. H. and F. W. Green Limited whose registered office is at Old Whittington Chesterfield in the County of Derby (hereinafter called 'the said Company') are the patrons or persons entitled to present or nominate to the said Benefice:

"And whereas the said Company desire to traffisfer the Advowson of the said Benefice to the Bishop of Chichester for the time being and are consenting to this Scheme (in testimony whereof they have affixed their Corporate Seal):

"And whereas we are satisfied that the transfer will tend to make better provision for the cure of souls

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend George, Bishop of Chichester (in testimony whereof he has executed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day recommend and propose that upon and from the dat of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assur-ance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Madehurst shell be transferred to the said George Bishen of shall be transferred to the said George, Bishop of Chichester, and his successors in the same Bishopric and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the Bishop of Chichester for the time being.'

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council: Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to

ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts. And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Chichester.
