The second part will be restricted to civil awards on the United Kingdom list as follows: appointments to the Fourth and Fifth Classes of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, and to the Companionship of the Imperial Service Order, together with awards of the British Empire Medal and Commendations for valuable service in the air.
