Nevertheless Pilot Officer MacKenzie continued his mission. A little later the bomber was again hit. The hydraulic gear was damaged, causing the main bomb doors to partially open and become jammed. The bomb aimer was desperately wounded. Despite a determined effort the bombs could not be released over the target and Pilot Officer MacKenzie set course for home. Meanwhile, Flight Sergeant Marlow and Sergeant Soloman gave all possible aid to their mortally wounded comrade and afterwards, in the face of great difficulties, resolutely executed their mortally wounded comrade and afterwards, in the face of great difficulties, resolutely executed their tasks, giving much assistance to their pilot in the homeward flight. Pilot Officer MacKenzie eventually reached base and, by a masterly effort landed the badly damaged aircraft, which was fully loaded with bombs, safely. This officer displayed courage, skill and determination of a high order, while Flight Sergeant Marlow and Sergeant Soloman set a fine example of courage and devotion to duty in very harassing circumstances.

As flight engineer, this airman has participated in a large number of sorties against important and well defended targets. He is a confident and trustworthy member of aircraft crew, and, on more than one occasion, when the aircraft has been damaged by enemy action his engineering skill has played a good part in the successful completion of the sortie. His record is worthy of great praise.

In October, 1943, this airman was the pilot of an aircraft which successfully attacked a U-boat during a patrol. His effort, brilliant in its execution, was worthy of great praise.
