SHEFFIELD AND DISTRICT GAS

(Application for a Special Order under the Gas Undertakings Acts, 1920 to 1934.)

THE Sheffield and District Gas Company (hereinafter called "the Company") whose address is Commercial Street, Sheffield 1, are applying to the Minister of Fuel and Power for a Special Order under the Gas Undertakings Acts 1920 to 1934 for the following objects:—

1. To provide for the sale and transfer to the Company of the undertaking of the Worsbroughdale and Worsbrough Gas Light and Coke Company Limited (hereinafter called "the Worsbrough Company"), to prescribe the date on which the said sale and transfer shall take effect and to make provision with respect to the carrying on of the said undertaking up to that date.

2. To prescribe the consideration to be paid by the Company to the Worsbrough Company for the sale and transfer to the Company of the undertaking of the Worsbrough Company.

3. To make provision with respect to the debts and liabilities of, and monies due or accruing due to, the Worsbrough Company and the payment and recovery thereof respectively, with respect to sums deposited by way of security with the Worsbrough Company, and with respect to the monies standing to the credit of the reserve fund and the reserve for renewals and replacements of the Worsbrough Company.

4. To make provision with respect to the retirement from or continuation in office of and the payment of compensation to the directors, officers and servants of the Worsbrough Company and with respect to the winding up and dissolution of that Company.

5. To authorise and empower the attendance at meetings of the Board of Directors of the Worsbrough Company of representatives of the Company.

6. To extend the limits of supply of the Company. A description of the proposed additional area of supply (hereinafter called "the added limits") may be inspected on or before the 2nd day of November 1945 at the Head Office of the Company, Commercial Street, Sheffield 1.

7. To authorise the Company to have and exercise within the added limits such of the powers, rights and privileges which they have and may exercise within their existing limits as the Order may provide.

8. To authorise the Company to continue maintain and use any mains pipes and other works of the Worsbrough Company to be transferred to and vested in the Company by the intended Order and to extend and apply to such mains pipes and works the provisions of the Sheffield and District Gas Acts and Orders 1929 to 1940, and of the intended Order with such exceptions and modifications as may be defined in the Order.

9. To authorise the Company to use certain lands (being the lands on which the existing gasworks of the Worsbrough Company are situate) for the manufacture and storage of gas and to work up and convert residual products of gas thereon. A description of the said lands may be inspected on or before the 2nd day of November 1945, at the Head Office of the Company, Commercial Street, Sheffield 1.

10. To prescribe the basic price for gas supplied by the Company within the added limits and to provide for the revision thereof: to authorise the Company to charge differential prices for gas in the added limits; and to make other provisions with respect to the terms and conditions for the supply of gas by the Company in the added limits.
