WAGES COUNCILS ACT, 1945.

LACE FINISHING WAGES COUNCIL (GREAT BRITAIN).

The Lace Finishing Wages Council (Great Britain, hereby gives notice of its intention to submit to the Minister of Labour and National Service proposals for (1) the revocation of the Orders L(16) and L(18) dated 19th January, 1938, and 6th December, 1940, respectively, and for the fixing of specified statutory minimum remuneration in substitution for the minimum rates of wages at present in operation and (2) for requiring holidays to be allowed to certain workers and for the fixing of holiday remuneration in respect of such holidays.

QUARRIES GENERAL REGUINTIONS (ELECTRICITY), 1938. METALLIFEROUS MINES GENERAL REGULATIONS, 1938.

The Minister of Fuel and Power gives notice that on the 27th day of October, 1945, under the powers conferred by Section 86 of the Coal Mines Act, 1911, as applied to Quarries by Section 158 of the Factories Act, 1937, and to Metalliferous Mines by Section 19 of the Mining Industries Act, 1920, he made General Regulations amending the Quarries General Regulations (Electricity), 1938, and the Metalliferous Mines General Regulations, 1938, as regards their application to electrical cables and apparatus which were in use at quarries and at the surface of Metalliferous Mines on 1st July, 1938, and these are published as S.R. & O.
