### TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England on Friday, the 20th September, 1946, at 1 p.m. for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, the National Loans Act, 1939, and the Miscellaneous Financial Provisions Act, 1946, to the amount of £150,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000 or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 23rd September, 1946, to Saturday, the 28th September, 1946, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday 12 noon) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

TEMPORARY (RECONSTRUCTION) REGULATIONS FOR APPOINTMENTS ON THE DEPARTMENT'S MARINE STAFF AS MALE SECOND OFFICER, MALE SECOND ENGINEER AND MALE MOTOR MECHANIC.

1. Application for appointment must be made to the Secretary of the Department at such time and in such manner as may be fixed by the Department. When any vacancy which is not to be filled by promotion within the existing staff occurs the Department will cause notice to be given by advertisement in the Press, and the last day fixed for the receipt of applications will be stated in such advertisement.

2. Candidates must have been born on or before 2nd August, 1905.

3. Every candidate must be either

(a) a natural born British subject

(i) having at least one parent who is or was at the time of death a British subject; or

(ii) of any other parentage, provided that he has resided in His Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of his appointment; or

(b) a naturalized British subject who has resided in His Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of his appointment; or

(c) a British subject who, although not fulfilling the requirements of sub-paragraph (a) or sub-paragraph (b) satisfies the Commissioners that he is so closely connected with His Majesty's dominions either by ancestry, upbringing or residence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in his favour.

4. Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate central education authority (that is, the Ministry of Education, the Scottish Education Department, or the Ministry of Education for Northern Ireland, as the case may be) has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

5. Candidates for the post of—

(a) Second Officer must hold at least the Ministry of Transport certificate as Master (Home Trade), and preference will be given to those holding certificates as Foreign or Extra Master.

(b) Second Engineer must hold at least the Ministry of Transport First Class Steam or Motor Certificate, and preference will be given to those holding the Extra First Class Certificate or a First Class Combined Steam and Motor Certificate.

(c) Motor Mechanics must have a good knowledge of Motor Marine Engines.

6. The application of those candidates who, in the opinion of the Department satisfy the conditions of these Regulations and are otherwise suitable will be considered by a Selection Board\* consisting of representatives of the Department and of the Civil Service Commission respectively.

7. The Selection Board, who will have before them the candidate's record of service and experience, will prepare a list in order of merit of those candidates whom they consider suitable for appointment.

8. Any attempt on the part of candidates to enlist support for their applications through Members of Parliament or other influential persons will disqualify them for appointment. The Selection Board will disregard as superfluous recommendations from persons who are not personally acquainted with the candidates' previous work.

9. The appointment of selected candidates will be subject to their satisfying the Civil Service Commissioners of their eligibility in respect of age, of nationality, health and character, and in such other directions as the Commissioners think fit, and will not be confirmed unless and until they have passed the prescribed period of probation to the satisfaction of the Department.
