REGULATIONS FOR FILLING THE POSTS OF DEPUTY CHIEF INSPECTOR, SUPERINTENDING INSPECTOR, INSPECTOR, GRADE I AND GRADE II, IN THE CHILDREN'S DEPARTMENT, AND PROBATION INSPECTOR, GRADE II, UNDER THE HOME OFFICE.

r. Both men and women are eligible for this Competition.

- 2. Preference will be given to candidates for the posts of Inspector, Grade I and II, and Probation Inspector, Grade II, who are between the ages of 28 and 40.
- 3. Candidates must be British subjects. The must also satisfy one of the following conditions:-
 - (a) If natural-born British subjects, they must either

(i) have at least one parent who is or was at death a British subject; or

(ii) have resided in His Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(b) If naturalized British subjects, they must have resided in His Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(c) If not qualified under (a) or (b) of this paragraph they must satisfy the Commissioners that they are so closely connected with His Majesty's dominions either by ancestry, upbringing or residence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in their favour. favour.

4. Preference will be given to candidates who possess the following qualifications:—

(i) Deputy Chief Inspector and Superintend-ing Inspector.

A University degree or equivalent qualifica-tions with a post-graduate diploma in teaching or social work or other relevant training, and such practical experience as fits them for these responsible administrative posts.

(ii) Inspectors, Grade I and Grade II.

A University degree or a diploma or certificate in social science or domestic science or institutional management, or other recognised training in educational or social work. Candidates should have a wide knowledge of social conditions in this country, and understanding

of behaviour problems, especially those of children and young people. Account will be taken of experience of residential institutions and homes for children, of boarding out, of work in child guidance clinics, and of family case work including health visitor work.

 (iii) Probation Inspector, Grade II.
 A University degree, preferably in sociology or a kindred subject, or a diploma or certificate in social science, or other recognised training in educational or social work. Candidates should have a wide knowledge of social conditions in this country, practical experience of family case work, and understanding of behaviour problems. Experience in probation work will be a recommendation.

5. Successful candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners as to their health and

The Civil Service Commissioners reserve the right to give such preference to disabled persons or to particular classes of disabled persons as may be necessary in order to give effect to any general policy regarding the employment of such persons which may be adopted by His Majesty's Government, provided that the disability is not of a nature to interfere with the discharge of the duties required.

- 6. No person who is undergoing a course of study with the aid of a grant from public funds shall be eligible to compete under these Regulations before the completion of the course, unless he has pre-viously obtained permission to do so from the authority which administers the grant.
- 7. Application for admission to the Competition must be made to the Home Office on the appropriate form within the time and in the manner of which notice is given by that Department.
- 8. Candidates who, from the information given on their application forms, are recommended by the Home Office and are accepted by the Civil Service Commissioners as having the best qualifications, will be summoned to an interview before a Selection Board who will recommend to the Commissioners for appointment to seah grade the Selection Board who will recommend to the Commissioners for appointment to each grade the candidates who appear to them to be the most suitable. The Selection Board may also recommend that a certain number of candidates shall be classed as reserves to be considered by the Commissioners for appointment in conjunction with the results of later interviews.
