A PROCLAMATION.

AMENDING THE PROVISIONS OF THE COINAGE ACT, 1870, AS APPLIED TO CERTAIN BRITISH POSSESSIONS.

GEORGE R.

Whereas an Order in Council was made on the 3rd day of February, 1898, approving a Proclamation (hereinafter called the Proclamation of 1898) which applied certain provisions of the Coinage Act, 1870, as amended, to the territories therein named:

And whereas under Section 11 of the said Act We have power, with the advice of Our Privy Council, to alter any Proclamation previously made:

We, therefore, in pursuance of the said Act and of all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, do hereby, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, proclaim, direct and ordain as follows:—

1. Section 5 of the Coinage Act, 1870, as applied by the Proclamation of 1898, is amended by inserting after the words "except by the Mint" the words "or as authorised by the law of a British Possession".

2. Section 6 of the Coinage Act, 1870, as so applied, is amended by adding at the end thereof the words "or according to coins which are made current and legal tender by the legislature of that Possession".

3. This Proclamation shall come into force forthwith.

Given at Our Court at Buckingham Palace this Thirteenth day of November, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and forty-seven, and in the Eleventh year of Our Reign.

"And whereas the said Lettice Mary Miller and Algernon Montagu Wyatt desire to transfer the advowson of the said benefice to the Bishop of Bath and Wells, for the time being and are consenting to this Scheme (in testimony whereof they have executed the same):

"And whereas we are satisfied that the transfer will tend to make better provision for the cure of souls:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend William, Bishop of Bath and Wells (in testimony whereof he has executed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice shall be transferred to the said William, Bishop of Bath and Wells, and his successors in the same Bishopric and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the Bishop of Bath and Wells for the time being."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Bath and Wells.

(b) In any earthen grave now existing in the said Churchyard, the burial may be allowed of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such

grave, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

(c) In the said Churchyard, in any grave space in which no interment has heretofore taken place, the burial may be allowed of the body of any person for whom or of any member of a family for which such grave space has been reserved and appropriated as a burial place, with the exclusive right of burial therein, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give Notice of such Representation and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council on the 29th day of December next.

(c) In the said Burial Ground, in any grave space in which no interment has heretofore taken place, the burial may be allowed of the body of any person for whom or of any member of a family for which such grave space has been reserved and appropriated as a burial place, with the exclusive right of burial therein, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give Notice of such Representation and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council on the 29th day of December next.

The following Address was presented to The King on the occasion of Their Majesties' visit to Plymouth to unveil the Foundation Stone of the new City Centre on Wednesday, October 29th, 1947:—

TO THEIR MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTIES KING GEORGE
THE SIXTH AND QUEEN ELIZABETH.

May it graciously please Your Majesties, We, the Lord Mayor, Aldermen and Councillors of the City of Plymouth, on behalf of all our Citizens and ourselves, loyally and dutifully offer to Your Majesties a most cordial welcome on the occasion of your visit to our City. We recall with pride and gratitude previous visits made to us by Your Majesties, particularly those which took place during continuance of the late War, and we deeply appreciate the great honour you have conferred upon us by coming to Plymouth again to-day.

The unveiling by Your Majesty of a Foundation Stone which is to commemorate the commencement of the reconstruction of the City becoming necessary through the great destruction caused by enemy action during the late War; and the naming of the two streets forming the axis of the layout of the new City Centre, will give great encouragement to the members of the Council and to the Citizens generally in their heavy task of rehabilitation, and this visit will long remain in their memories as a token of Your Majesties' continued interest in this Naval Port.

We humbly assure Your Majesties of our constant loyalty to the Throne and of our devotion to Yourself and fervently pray that Almighty God will bestow His Divine Blessing upon you both and spare you to enjoy a long and happy reign over your faithful subjects.

To which Address His Majesty was pleased to return the following gracious Answer:—

My Lord Mayor,

The Queen and I are very glad to be here to-day and to take part in this historic ceremony.

When last we came to Plymouth we saw with deep sorrow the heavy damage which the enemy

had wrought on your ancient city. We were grieved that many of your citizens had been killed, thousands made homeless, and that your civic life, your commerce and your industry had been crippled. Yet amid all the human misery and material destruction which the enemy caused, we were heartened, and filled with pride, by the unconquerable spirit of your citizens. No matter what the dangers and difficulties, they refused to be cast down, and they never flinched in their resolution to carry on and to win through to victory. I thank them, each and all, for the part they played in defeating the enemy, whether in the fighting services, in civil defence, in industry or in keeping the home-going.

But now, happily, those days are only a tragic memory and we can celebrate the commencement of a great work of peaceful reconstruction. I congratulate you on the foresight and confidence which inspired you during the darkest days of war to look forward to this fine work of peace. Many of the historic treasures of your past have gone and can never be replaced, but you have as your object the building of a fine city based on a lofty ideal which will command the support of all men and women of good will, and be worthy of your best traditions. The difficulties to be overcome before that ideal is realized are no less than those we faced together during the war; but I am sure that the people of Plymouth will bring to all the tasks of reconstruction, national as well as local, the same high qualities of industry, vision, and courage with which they have surmounted the trials of the past. I wish you, my Lord Mayor, Godspeed in the work of reconstruction, and with very real pleasure now unveil the foundation stone and name the two streets of your new city centre, Royal Parade and Armada Way.

The following Address was presented to The King on the occasion of the opening of the new Reservoir of the Metropolitan Water Board at Staines on Friday, November 7th, 1947:—

The Members and Staff of the Metropolitan Water Board respectfully beg to express their gratitude and thanks to Your Majesties for graciously consenting to visit this site to-day and their great pleasure that it has been found possible for Their Royal Highnesses The Princess Elizabeth and Princess Margaret to accompany Your Majesties.

On the happy occasion of the approaching marriage of Her Royal Highness The Princess Elizabeth, may I, on behalf of the Members of the Board and the company here assembled, offer sincere wishes for the health and happiness of the Princess and her future husband.

This reservoir, which will provide a very substantial addition to London's reserve supplies of water, will take several weeks to fill and when full will hold about 4½ thousand million gallons of water.

This reservoir has been constructed by John Mowlem & Co., Ltd. at the outbreak of war about three quarters of the work had been completed. Operations were continued throughout the War but at a greatly reduced rate. It is interesting to note that the labour on the greater portion of the concrete lining to the reservoir embankments was performed by German prisoners-of-war.

But if the work of construction was retarded the site became the scene of considerable activity of quite another kind. The main experimental trials of mobile flame-throwers for military purposes were carried out inside this reservoir and almost on this exact spot many of the experimental burners for the dispersal of fog on airfields were developed. We are glad to think of the success which attended these experiments and to know that the wartime work in connection with fog dispersal has been carried forward into the peace.

The privilege of serving the Nation in this and other ways in the heavy responsibilities imposed by the War is a source of gratification to us.

This reservoir which is the second largest in the Board's area will bring our total storage capacity to nearly 22½ thousand million gallons.

Twenty years ago this quantity would have been regarded as an ample reserve against any possible contingency, but to-day, the vast improvement in housing conditions has resulted in an ever increasing demand for water which has become a source of great anxiety to us. This period of anxiety must continue until it is possible to complete projected works of considerable magnitude in the Thames Valley

area, and until then the rainfall and weather conditions generally must remain for the Members and Officers of the Board a matter of grave concern and significance.

The modernisation and extensions of the Board's plant to cope with this increasing demand for water are of necessity on a huge scale that calls for planning many years ahead, yet the 43 years of the Board's life have been most seriously interrupted by two world wars and hardly less seriously by the economic crisis of 1931.

So to-day we all humbly pray that peace may accompany Your Majesties' Reign for many, many years; that the arts of peace may flourish, and that we may discharge this essential duty of providing 6½ million of Your Majesties' loyal subjects with an ample supply of pure and wholesome water.

May it please Your Majesty to honour the Board by now putting the pumps into operation and, having admitted the water, to name the reservoir.

To which Address His Majesty was pleased to return the following gracious Answer:—

I am very glad, Mr. Chairman, to be here to-day with The Queen to open this new Reservoir, and thank you for your kind words of welcome.

I want to take this opportunity, as one who lives in London, to pay my sincere tribute to the magnificent work of the Metropolitan Water Board in maintaining London's water supply during the War. No matter what damage the enemy did to your vast and intricate system, none of my people in London was ever deprived of the supply of pure water which is so essential in a great city. That is a record of which the Board have every right to be proud. I thank and congratulate all those who played a part in it.

The Queen and I have been interested to learn of the use made of this site for experimental work, which has contributed not only to our victory in the War, but also to the increasing safety of civil aviation. To-day, however, we inaugurate this new Reservoir for its proper purpose. The Board have found many difficulties in finishing this undertaking, so vital to the health and well-being of the people of London. I congratulate you on your foresight in planning this Reservoir, and on the enterprise and determination with which all engaged on its construction have surmounted the obstacles in the way of its completion. I wish the Board every success in the important work on which they are engaged, and of which this great new Reservoir is the latest, but by no means the last, completed project.

It is with very real pleasure that I now open this Reservoir and name it "The King George the Sixth Reservoir".

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday 12 noon) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords' Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.
