**WAGES COUNCILS ACTS, 1945 TO 1948.**

**RETAIL DRAPERY, OUTFITTING AND FOOTWEAR TRADES WAGES COUNCIL (GREAT BRITAIN).**

The Retail Drapery, Outfitting and Footwear Trades Wages Council (Great Britain) hereby gives notice of its intention to submit to the Minister of Labour and National Service proposals (1) for the revocation of the Retail Drapery, Outfitting and Footwear Trades Wages Council (Great Britain) Wages Regulation Order, 1949 (Order R.D.O.(3)), and for the fixing of statutory minimum remuneration in substitution for the statutory minimum remuneration fixed by Order R.D.O.(3) and (2) for the amendment of the Retail Drapery, Outfitting and Footwear Trades Wages Council (Great Britain) Wages Regulation (Holidays) Order, 1949 (Order R.D.O.(4)).

Particulars of the proposals may be obtained on application to the Secretary of the Wages Council at the address given below.

The Wages Council will consider any written representations with respect to the above-mentioned proposals which may be sent to it within twenty-eight days from 21st February, 1950. Any such representation should be signed by the person making the same (adding his or her address) and sent to the Secretary, Retail Drapery, Outfitting and Footwear Trades Wages Council (Great Britain), Ebury Bridge House, Ebury Bridge Road, London, S.W.1. It is desirable that persons making objections should state the precise grounds of their objections.
