WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 11th day of January, 1951, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Supplementary Scheme, under Section 11 of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, for making certain alterations in the provisions of an Order of His late Majesty King George the Fifth in Council dated the 12th day of February, 1931, and published in the London Gazette on the 17th day of February in the same year for effecting the union of the benefice of Kintbury and the benefice of Avington in the diocese of Oxford.

### "SUPPLEMENTARY SCHEME

"Whereas by Clause 3 of the said Order of His late Majesty in Council it was directed that a curate should be appointed to assist the incumbent in performing the duties of the united benefice and that a stipend of £300 per annum should be assigned to the curate out of the revenues of the united benefice:

"Now therefore we the said Church Commis-

"Now, therefore, we, the said Church Commissioners, with the consent of the Right Reverend Kenneth, Bishop of Oxford (in witness whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty in Council that the said Order of His late Majesty in Council shall be altered as follows: that is to say:

as follows, that is to say:
"There shall be substituted for the said Clause 3
the following new Clause:—

'3. That after the union has taken effect, the incumbent of the united benefice shall, in order to assist him in performing the duties of the united benefice, employ a curate or such other clerical or lay assistance as the Bishop of the diocese shall from the time to time direct and a part of the endowments of lay assistance as the Bishop of the diocese shall from time to time direct and a part of the endowments of the united benefice, namely, so much of the moneys appropriated to the benefice of Kintbury pursuant to the Tithe Act, 1936, as will produce £150 per annum, shall be appropriated as a fund towards the cost of providing such assistance as aforesaid, and the said fund shall be paid by us, the Church Commissioners, to the Diocesan Board of Finance of the said diocese as trustees to apply the same accordingly."

And whereas the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, and the Union of

Benefices Rules, 1926 to 1930, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that it shall be and become effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette.

"And whereas the endowments and property belonging to the See of St. Albans or held in trust therefor or for the Bishop thereof are described and referred to in the Schedule hereunder written:

"Now therefore, we, the said Church Commissioners, recommend and propose that upon and from the first day of January, 1951, all the endowments securities and other property described and referred to in the said Schedule and all other if any the endowments belonging to or held in trust for the said Bishopric shall vest in us the said Church Commissioners pursuant to the said Measure

and that we shall be entitled absolutely to the benefit rents and profit thereof upon and from that

date.

"And we further recommend and propose that we shall pay to the Bishop for the time being of the See by equal quarterly instalments in respect of the quarters ended on the thirty-first day of March the thirtieth day of June the thirtieth day of September and the thirty-first day of December in every year the first such instalment to be the full quarter's payment due for the quarter ended on the thirty-first day of March, 1951, an annual stipend comprising the sum of £2,000 and also such sum not exceeding £550 in any one year as we shall have been duly satisfied has been expended by him in connection with the travelling required in and for the carrying out of his official duties and obligations as Bishop. tions as Bishop.

# BURIAL, ENGLAND DISCONTINUANCE

THE BURIAL GROUNDS (HARTFORD) ORDER, 1951. 29th January, 1951

At the Court at Buckingham Palace the 29th day of January, 1951.

### PRESENT.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Minister of Health, after giving 10 days' previous notice of his intention in that behalf, has, under the provisions of the Burial Act, 1853 (16 & 17 Vict. c. 134), as amended by subsequent enactments, made a Representation to His Majesty in Council that for the protection of the public health, the opening of any new burial ground in

the Borough of Huntingdon in the county of Huntingdon, save with the previous approval of the Minister of Health, should be prohibited, and that burials should be discontinued therein as hereinafter

directed:
And Whereas by an Order in Council of the 2nd November, 1950, Notice of such Representation was given, and it was ordered that the same should be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council on the 18th day of December next, and such Order has been published in the London Gazette, and copies thereof have been affixed, as required by the said Act:

Hartford.—Forthwith and entirely in the Church-yard of the Parish Church of All Saints, Hartford, in the said Borough of Huntingdon,

Provided that-

(a) In any vault or walled grave now existing in the said Churchyard, burial may be allowed subject to the condition that every coffin buried in such vault or grave be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

(b) In any earthen grave now existing in the said Churchyard, the burial may be allowed of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such grave, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the grave face of the ground adjoining the grave.

face of the ground adjoining the grave.

(c) In the said Churchyard, in any grave space in which no interment has heretofore taken place, the burial may be allowed of the body of any person for whom or of any member of a family for which such grave space has been reserved and appropriated as a burial place, with the exclusive right of burial therein, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

(c) In the said portion of the Churchyard, in (c) In the said portion of the Churchyard, in any grave space in which no interment has here-tofore taken place, the burial may be allowed of the body of any person for whom or of any member of a family for which such grave space has been reserved and appropriated as a burial place, with the exclusive right of burial therein, while to the condition that he part of the coffic subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

March next.

(ii) Married women who have formerly been established civil servants and have drawn marriage gratuity (other than those who resigned compulsorily on marriage and whose resignation took effect before 15th October, 1946, or who are widows or divorced, or who are separated from their husbands, or whose husbands suffer without hope of recovery from total mental or physical incapacity) will not be eligible unless they undertake to refund on appointment the marriage gratuity paid. marriage gratuity paid.
