During the recent riots in Singapore, the bus in which Trooper Moppett was riding was stopped by a crowd in order to set it on fire. Trooper Moppett escaped by a rear window and got away. Shortly afterwards while skirting another crowd he saw a car being attacked by some 20 to 30 hooligans. He went straight into them brushing them aside and found a European woman and two children being attacked. One child was injured. He rescued them and escorted them to the Mount-He rescued them and escorted them to the Mounthe rescued them and escorted them to the Mount-batten Club. Having escorted them to the Mountbatten Club and having given them "first aid" he returned and rescued the car. Through-out Trooper Moppett acted with great coolness and courage and upheld the highest traditions of the Army.
