EXPERIMENTAL OFFICERS AND ASSISTANT EXPERIMENTAL OFFICERS IN VARIOUS GOVERNMENT DEPARTMENTS.

Age.
 For the Experimental Officer grade candidates must be at least 26 years and under 31 years of age on

31st December, 1952, i.e., they must have been born on or after 1st January, 1922 and on or before 31st December, 1926.

Candidates for the Assistant Experimental Officer grade must be at least 18 years and under 28 years of age on 31st December, 1952, i.e., they must have been born on or after 1st January, 1925 and on or before 31st December, 1934.

But for each grade a candidate who has served or is serving on a regular (including a regular short-service) engagement in H.M. Forces may for this purpose deduct his period of such service from his actual age. Service in H.M. Forces on a Duration of Emergency engagement or under the National Service Acts cannot be reckoned for this purpose.

2. Sex and Marriage

(i) Both men and women may compete under these

(ii) Married women who have formerly been established Civil Servants and have drawn marriage gratuity (other than those who resigned compulsorily on marriage and whose resignation took effect before 15th October, 1946, or who are widows or divorced, or who are separated from their husbands, or whose husbands suffer without hope of recovery from total physical or mental incapacity) will not be eligible unless they undertake to refund on appointment the marriage gratuity paid.

3. Nationality.
Candidates must be British subjects. They must also satisfy one of the following conditions:—
(a) If natural-born British subjects, they must

(vii) Candidates who are not in possession of such certificate or equivalent qualifications may be admitted exceptionally by the Commissioners, at their discretion, if evidence of suitable experience on scientific research and development work can be produced; such candidates at present serving in a Government Department must be certified by that Department as being worthy of consideration. Candidates over 20 (other than Established Assistants (Scientific)) will generally be expected to have a Pass Degree or to have a technical qualification of similar standard, e.g., Higher National Certificate.

5. Application

A candidate sitting for an examination during 1952 with a view to obtaining any of the qualifications set out above may be admitted to the Competition before the result of the examination is known. He will not, however, be declared successful unless on the result of the examination he satisfies Regulation 4.
