"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursu-

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for constituting a new parish to be taken out of the parishes of Saint Peter, Rochester; Saint John, Chatham; and Saint Paul, Chatham; in the diocese of Rochester.

# **"** SCHEME

"Whereas we, the Church Commissioners, satisfied that the spiritual interests of the area defined in the subjoined Schedule and delineated on the map hereto annexed would be best served by constituting it a new parish:

"And whereas we are satisfied that a suitable

endowment therefor will be provided:

'And Whereas we have not approved any consecrated church within the area as suitable to be the

parish church of the new parish:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Christopher, Bishop of Rochester (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and affixed his episcopal seal to this Scheme), we, the said Church Commissioners de humbly recommended and process Commissioners, do humbly recommend and propose as follows, that is to say:—

"1. Constitution.
"(a) As from the day of the date of the licence thereto of a minister, the area defined in the subjoined Schedule and delineated on the map. hereto annexed shall be a separate district for spiritual purposes.

"(b) As from the date of the consecration of a church within the area, approved by us, the said Church Commissioners, as suitable to be a parish

church, or if the church is consecrated before such approval, the date of the approval, the said area shall become a new parish.

"(c) The name of the district (or parish as the case may be) shall be 'The District (or Parish) of Saint Stephen, Chatham'.

"2. Archdeaconry and Rural Deanery.

"The parish shall be in the Archdeaconry of Rochester and in the rural deanery of Rochester.

# "THE SCHEDULE

"The area comprising:

"All those contiguous parts (together coloured pink on the map annexed hereto) of the parishes of pink on the map annexed hereto) of the parishes of Saint Peter, Rochester; Saint John, Chatham; and Saint Paul, Chatham; which are bounded on the west and on part of the south by the parish of Saint Margaret, Rochester, on further part of the south by the parish of Aylesford and on the remaining sides as follows (that is to say) by an imaginary line commencing on the boundary which divides the parish of Saint Margaret, Rochester, from the parish of Saint Peter, Rochester, at the junction of Saint Williams Way and City Way and continuing thence northeastwards along the middle junction of Saint Williams Way and City Way and continuing thence northeastwards along the middle of City Way to a point opposite the middle of the western end of Pattons Lane and continuing thence southeastwards to and along the middle of the last mentioned lane to a point opposite the middle of the southwestern end of Beresford Avenue and continuing theses first northeastwards Avenue and continuing thence first northeastwards then southeastwards and again northeastwards to and along the middle of the last mentioned Avenue and along the middle of Wyles Road (thereby crossing Balfour Road) to a point opposite the middle of the northeastern end of Ewart Road and continuing thence southwestwards to and along the middle of the last mentioned Road to a point the middle of the last mentioned Road to a point opposite the middle of the western end of Randal Road and continuing thence southeastwards to and along the middle of the last mentioned Road and along the iniquie of the last mentioned Road and in the same straight line in continuation thereof to a point in the middle of Maidstone Road on the boundary which divides the parish of Saint John, Chatham, from the parish of Saint Paul, Chatham, and continuing thence southwards along the middle of the last mentioned Road to a point opposite the middle of the parish of Saint Paul, the middle of the last mentioned Road to a point opposite the middle of the western end of Bourn-ville Avenue (thereby following the boundary which divides the last mentioned parishes) and continuing thence eastwards to and along the middle of the last mentioned Avenue and in the same straight line in continuation thereof to a point in the middle of Palmerston Road and continuing thence northeastwards along the middle of tinuing thence northeastwards along the middle of the last mentioned Road to a point opposite the middle of the northwestern end of Kitchener Avenue and continuing thence southeastwards to and along the middle of the last mentioned Avenue to the point where it meets the southwestern corner of the boundary which divides the parish of All of Saint Paul, Chatham, from the parish of All

Saints, Chatham, and continuing thence south-eastwards along the last mentioned boundary to the boundary which divides the parish of Saint Paul, Chatham, from the parish of Christ Church, Luton, and continuing then southwestwards along the last mentioned boundary to the point where the boundaries of the parishes of Saint John, Chatham; Saint Paul, Chatham; and Christ Church, Luton; all meet and continuing thence southwards along the boundary which divides the parish of Saint John, Chatham, from the parish of Christ Church, Luton, to a point opposite the middle of the northeastern end of the footpath leading from the southeastern corner of the grounds of the pumping station of the Chatham and District Water Company to Lansdowne Road and continuing thence southwestwards in an continuing thence southwestwards in imaginary line to and along the middle of the last mentioned footpath and in the same line in conmentioned footpath and in the same line in continuation thereof to a point in the middle of Lansdowne Road and continuing thence first westwards and then southwestwards along the middle of the last mentioned Road and along the middle of the footpath in continuation thereof leading to Robin Hood Lane to a point opposite the southeastern end of the walls or fences which divide closes number 223, 202 and 198 on the said map from close numbered 222 and continuing thence first northwestwards and then southwestwards to first northwestwards and then southwestwards to and along the last mentioned walls or fences to the boundary which divides the parish of Saint John, Chatham, from the parish of Aylesford."

And Whereas the provisions of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme, have been duly complied

And Whereas the said Scheme has been approved at the Council held under the authority of the said Letters Patent:

Now, therefore, His Royal Highness The Duke of Gloucester and the Earl of Harewood, being authorized thereto by the said Letters Patent, have taken the said Scheme into consideration, and do hereby, by and with the advice of Her Majesty's Privy Council, on Her Majesty's behalf ratify the said Scheme and order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the Jordon Gazette pursuant to the said Measure the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And do hereby, by and with the like advice, direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Rochester.

"2. The union shall take effect upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette.

In every series of three successive turns of presentation to the united benefice after the union presentation to the united benefice after the union has taken effect, the alternate patron of the benefice of Newton St. Petrock with Abbots Bickington and Bulkworthy who but for this Scheme would now be entitled to make the next presentation thereto shall have the first turn, the patron of the benefice of Milton Damerel with Cookbury shall have the second turn and the other alternate patron of the benefice of Newton Saint Petrock with Abbots Bickington and Bulkworthy shall have the third turn.

"5. (a) Subject as hereinafter provided any sur-

(a) Subject as hereinafter provided any surplus, calculated by us for the twelve months ending on the 31st March in each year, of the endowment income (calculated as prescribed in Part Two of the Schedule hereto) of the united benefice over and above an annual sum of £645 shall, with effect from the date upon which the union shall take effect, be paid to and be held by us for the benefit of the diocesan stipends fund of the diocese of Exeter. "(b) The said endowment income and the said surplus and the said annual sum of £645 shall be

deemed to accrue from day to day and shall when we deem that circumstances so require be apportionable acordingly.

- "(c) Any moneys due to us from the incumbent of the united benefice, or, during any vacancy in the united benefice, from the sequestrators thereof, as the case may be (hereinafter called 'the incumbent or sequestrators') upon the calculation of the said surplus shall be paid by the incumbent or sequestrators to us not later than the 30th June in each year and shall be recoverable as a debt due to us.
- "(d) For the purpose of ascertaining the amounts the said endowment income and of the said of the said endowment income and surplus, we shall have power to require production by the incumbent or sequestrators of accounts and other documents in relation thereto, and the said

accounts for the twelve months to 31st March in each year (or where applicable for a part of the year ending on that date) shall be rendered annually year ending on that date) shall be rendered annually to us within six weeks of that date in such form as we shall prescribe; and in the event of failure by the incumbent or sequestrators to produce such accounts or documents we shall have all legal remedies for enforcing production thereof.

"6. The united benefice shall be in the arch-deaconry of Totnes and the rural deanery of Holsworthy.

the whole of the endowments and property then belonging to the benefices of Upton Grey and Weston Patrick, form part of the endowments of

the united benefice.

"(vi) (a) Subject as hereinafter provided any surplus, "(vi) (a) Subject as hereinafter provided any surplus, calculated by us for the twelve months ending on the 31st March in each year, of the endowment income (calculated in accordance with the schedule hereto) of the united benefice over and above an annual sum of £621 shall, with effect from the date upon which the union shall take effect, be paid to and be held by us for the benefit of the diocesan stipends fund of the diocese of Winchester.

"(b) The said endowment income and the said surplus and the said annual sum of £621 shall be deemed to accrue from day to day and shall when we deem that circumstances so require be apportionable
