"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, and the Diocesan Stipends Funds Measure, 1953, and with the consent of the Right Reverend Robert, Bishop of Exeter (in witness whereof he has signed the Scheme), now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared for

effecting the unions (1) of the benefice of Holsworthy and the chapelry of Cookbury (now part of the benefice of Milton Damerel with Cookbury) and (2) of the benefice of Newton St. Petrock with Abbots Bickington and Bulkworthy and the remaining part of the said benefice of Milton Damerel with Cookbury, all of which benefices are situate in the diocese of Exeter.
