1. Age.
Candidates must be at least 16 and under 18 years of age on 1st September, 1954.

2. Sex.

Both boys and girls are eligible.

3. Nationality.

Candidates must be British subjects. The also satisfy one of the following conditions: They must

(a) If natural-born British subjects, they must either

(i) have at least one parent who is or was at death a British subject; or
(ii) have resided in Her Majesty's dominions

and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(b) If naturalised British subjects, they must have resided in Her Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight

(c) If not qualified under (a) or (b) of this paragraph, they must satisfy the Commissioners that they are so closely connected with Her Majesty's dominions either by ancestry, upbringing or residence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in their favour.

4. Education.

(i) Candidates must, by the date on which they submit their application forms, have passed in one and the same examination for the General Certificate of Education, in 1952, 1953 or 1954, at the Ordinary level in English Language and at Ordinary Advanced) level in four of the following optional subjects:

(1) English Literature;
(2) one or two of: Mathematics; Pure Mathematics; Applied Mathematics; Pure and Applied Mathematics; Elementary, Additional, Higher, Further, or General Mathematics;
