## PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by the Burial Act, 1855, 18 & 19 Vict. c. 128, it was, amongst other things, enacted that it should be lawful for Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, from time to time to postpone the time appointed by any Order in Council for the discontinuance of burials, or otherwise to vary any Order in Council made under any of the Acts recited in the said Act, or under the said Act (whether the time thereby appointed for the discontinuance of burials thereunder, or other operation of such Order, should or should not have arrived), as to Her Majesty, with such advice as aforesaid, might seem fit:

And Whereas an Order in Council was made on the 30th day of November, 1882 (hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Order") directing the discontinuance of burials in the Churchyard of the Parish Church of Wollaston, in the county of Northampton:

And Whereas it seems fit to Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, that the Principal Order in so far as it relates to burials in earthen graves in the said Churchyard should be varied:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice aforesaid, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

1. The Principal Order shall have effect subject to the following exception or qualification, viz.:—

That, notwithstanding anything in the said Order in Council of the 30th day of November, 1882, the burial may be allowed after death of the body of Annie Woodrow in the grave of her aunt Helen Whitehead in the said Churchyard.

2. This Order may be cited as the Burial Grounds (Wollaston) (Variation) Order, 1955.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice aforesaid, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

1. The Principal Order shall have effect subject to the following exception or qualification, viz.:—

That, notwithstanding anything in the said Order in Council of the 24th day of June, 1954, the burial of the body of the late Adeline Beatrice Caroline Davey, may be allowed in the family grave in the said Churchyard.

2. This Order may be cited as the Burial Grounds (Woodhall Spa) (Variation) Order, 1955.
