2. Candidates may take optional subjects up to a total of 500 marks. A candidate who wishes to offer subjects the value of which exceeds 500 marks must name a subject to be marked on a reduced maximum in order to bring the total to 500. (ii) Candidates may not offer more than three of the subjects Chemistry, Part I (48), Physics, Part I (50), Botany, Part I (52), Geology, Part I (54), Zoology, Part I (56).
(e) Candidates may not offer more than two of the three periods of English Literature (66-68).
(f) Greek Literature (75) may be taken only by candidates who offer Greek Translation (72), and Latin Literature (76).

and Latin Literature (79) only by those who offer Latin Translation (76). (g) Candidates may not offer Language papers (modern languages, Latin or Greek) totalling more than 400 marks. Similarly Literature or Civilisa-tion papers (including English Literature) may not be offered carrying a maximum of more than 400 marks. Thus no candidate may offer French Language, German Language, and Spanish Language, or French Civilisation, German Civilisation, and English Literature. The papers on the History of the French Language, the History of the German Language, Old English, Middle English, and English Criticism, do not come within the scope of this restriction.
