(IMMUNITIES AND PRIVILEGES) ACT, 1950.

In pursuance of subsection (1) (c) of section 2 of the International Organisations (Immunities and Privileges) Act, 1950 (14 Geo. 6. Chapter 14), Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs has compiled the following amended list of persons who are entitled to immunities and privileges conferred by the Diplomatic Privileges (International Civil Aviation Organisation) Order in Council, 1949, as amended by the Diplomatic Privileges (World Health Organisation and International Civil Aviation Organisation) (Amendment) Order in Council, 1949 and the International Organisations (Immunities and Privileges of the International Civil Aviation Organisation) (Amendment No. 2) Order, 1954, the said list taking effect in relation to each person from the date specified after his or her name, being the date as from which, for the purposes of the said Orders in Council, such person first held the office or employment in question.
