NATIONAL PARKS AND ACCESS TO THE COUNTRYSIDE ACT, 1949

Lowestoft Borough Council Caldecott Road Railway Crossing Public Path Order, 1959

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Housing and Local Government in pursuance of the powers conferred upon him by section 41 of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949, after consultation with the Lowestoft Borough Council proposes to make an Order for the creation of a public right of way on foot from Hall Road to the Caldecott Road Railway Crossing, Lowestoft.

The draft Order relates to land situate in the borough of Lowestoft in the County of East Suffolk.

The effect of the Order will be to create a public right of way on foot from a point on the south side of Hall Road, near its junction with Broad Road, leading in a southerly direction for a distance of 318 feet and passing under the railway line by means of a subway.

A certified copy of the draft Order and of the map contained therein has been deposited at the offices of the Lowestoft Borough Council, Town Hall, Lowestoft and at the Ministry of Housing and Local Government, Whitehall, London S.W.1, and will be open for inspection free of charge during normal office hours.

Any objection or representation with reference to the draft Order may be sent in writing to the Secretary, Ministry of Housing and Local Government, Whitehall, London S.W.1, before the 1st day of May 1959, and any such objection or representation should state the grounds on which it is made.
