CHANGE OF NAME AND ARMS-ROYAL LICENCE

Whitehall, London S.W.1.

1st May 1962.

Her Majesty QUEEN ELIZABETH II was graciously pleased on the 1st day of May 1962, to give and grant unto John Michael Foxley Norris (now John Michael Foxley Watt Foxley Norris) of Cruxton Manor Farm in the Parish of Maiden Newton in the County of Dorset, Gentleman, Her Royal Licence and Authority that he may henceforth take and use the surname of Watt in addition to and before that of Norris and also take and use the surname of Foxley of Norris and also take and use the surname of Foxley in addition to and after that of Watt and before that of Norris, and that he may bear the Arms of Watt only, and that such surname and Arms may in like manner be taken borne and used by his issue, the said Arms being first exemplified according to the Laws of Arms and recorded in the College of Arms otherwise the said Royal Licence and Permis-sion to be void and of none effect.

And to command that the said Royal Concession and Declaration be recorded in the said College of Arms. (106)
