(Restrictions on Waiting) Order, 1962

To revoke the County of Durham (Stockton-on-Tees) (Traffic Regulation) Order, '1956, and the Trunk Road (High Street, Stockton-on-Tees) (Amendment) Order, '1958 (which Orders imposed restrictions on vehicles with regard to waiting in parts of High Street, Nionton Road and Yarm Lane, Stockton-on-Tees);
- 2. To provide that no person shall cause or permit any vehicle to wait between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m.:
 - (a) on any of the sides of the East of Snaith— York Thirsk—Stockton-on-Tees—Sunderland Trunk Road (All9) in the Borough of Stocktonon-Tees specified in the First Schedule hereto; or (b) on the side of the aforesaid trunk road speci-fied in the Second Schedule hereto:

(i) for a longer period than twenty minutes; æ

(ii) if a period of less than forty minutes has elapsed since the termination during the said hours of the last period of waiting (if any) of the vehicle on that side.

The expression "postal vehicle" means a vehicle being used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets as defined in section 87 of the Post Office Act, 1953.

3. To enable a vehicle to be used in connection

with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance of the
