TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS

1. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 17th August 1962, at 1 p.m. for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the National Loans Act, 1939, to the amount of £230,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000 or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 20th August 1962, to Saturday, the 25th August 1962, inclusive, and will be due 91 days after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House, or Broker.

6. Notification will be sent by post on the same day as Tenders are received to the persons whose Tenders are accepted in whole or in part and payment in full of the amounts due in respect of such accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday, 11.30 a.m.) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that they have made an Order under section 21 of the Finance Act, 1948, as amended by Part II of Schedule 2 to the Finance Act, 1958, entitled The Purchase Tax (No. 4) Order 1962.

The exemption from purchase tax for certain weightless tapes, which has applied only to tapes made of cotton thread, is extended by this Order to tapes made of paper yarns or of man-made fibre yarns which comply with the description contained in the Order.

The Order comes into operation on the 8th August 1962 and has been published as Statutory Instruments 1962, No. 11686.

The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that They have made an Order under sections 9 and 13 of, and Schedules 5 and 6 to, the Import Duties Act, 1958, viz.: The Import Duty Drawbacks (Consolidation) Order, 1962.

This Order consolidates the existing provisions relating to the allowance of drawback of import duty under the Import Duties Act, 1958, on the exportation of specified imported articles or goods incorporating those imported articles and of certain goods produced or manufactured from specified imported articles.

The Order comes into operation on the 11th August 1962, and has been published as Statutory Instruments 1962, No. 11685.
