PRESENT.

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council Whereas a Representation duly made to Her Majesty in Council by the Minister of Housing and Local Government that, for the protection of the Public Health, burials should be discontinued as hereinafter directed in St. Mary's Churchyard, Heworth, Gateshead, County Durham, has, in pursuance of an Order in Council made the 20th day of January 1964, and duly published, been taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred on Her by section one of the Burial Act, 1853 (16 & 17 Vict. c. 134), and of all other powers Her enabling, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is

hereby ordered, as follows:

1. Burials shall be discontinued forthwith and entirely in St. Mary's Churchyard, Heworth, Gateshead, in the said County.

Provided that

(a) In any vault or walled grave now existing in the said Churchyard, burial may be allowed subject to the condition that every coffin buried in such vault or grave be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

(b) In any earthen grave now existing in the said Churchyard, the burial may be allowed of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such grave, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

2. This Order may be cited as the Burial Grounds (St. Mary's Churchyard, Heworth, Gateshead, County Durham) Order, 1964.

All imported potatoes must be packed in new bags or other new containers which, as from 1st January

1965, must be marked with the name of the country of origin (except in the case of hampers). They must be accompanied by a health certificate as in Schedule 1 and, if not shipped direct from the country of origin, by supplemental certificates as in Schedule 2.

The landing of seed potatoes and of potatoes from countries not listed in Schedule 3 is wholly prohibited. Inspectors of the Ministry of Agriculture, Fisheries

and Food and the Department of Agriculture and Fisheries for Scotland are empowered to examine and take samples of imported potatoes. Provision is made for the disposal of those found to be unhealthy and of any potatoes landed in contravention of the Order.
