## Greeting!


Whereas We are desirous of recognising outstanding achievements in industry either in increasing exports or in technological innovation We do by these Presents for Us, Our Heirs and Successors institute and create a new Award and We do hereby direct that it shall be governed by the following rules and ordinances:

Firstly: The Award shall be designated and styled "The Queen's Award to Industry".

Secondly: Recipients of the Award shall be entitled to use an emblem approved by Us and to display it on flags, plaques, lapel badges, note-paper, packaging or goods and in other ways consistent with the dignity of recognition granted under the terms of this Our Warrant, and in accordance with the Grant of Appointment.

Thirdly: The emblem shall consist of

Fretty of two pieces each way terminating in chief and base in pheons aligned in the form of a rectangle and fessewise in demi-cogwheels projecting to the dexter and the sinister thereof, the whole surmounted by the Royal Crown all Or





which may be displayed upon a flag Azure to be flown at the place or places authorised or may be used as a device or badge in the manner above prescribed and as hereto appended.

Fourthly: There shall be prepared for the guidance of Award holders a Manual which shall prescribe and illustrate the forms of display to be adopted by holders of the Award.

Fifthly: The title to display the emblem shall be conveyed by a document to be known as the Grant

of Appointment which shall specify the industrial unit or units entitled to display the emblem.

Sixthly: The currency of an Award shall lapse after five years. Except where otherwise provided in the Manual of Guidance the date of the year of the Award shall appear on the emblem or in association with it. A fresh Award in a later year shall be signified by an emblem bearing the new date, and the holder will be entitled to display the emblem for five years from that date. During the five years
