PRICES AND INCOMES ACT 1966

Report of the National Board for Prices and Incomes Pay of Workers in Agriculture in England and Wales

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1962

The Secretary of State hereby gives notice that he has made an Order under section 153 of the above Act entitled "The Diversion of Highways (County of Flint) (No. 2) Order 1967" authorising the diversion of a footpath at Broughton, Flint, and involving the provision of a new footpath.

HIGHWAYS ACT 1959

The London—Fishguard Trunk Road (Nantycaws, Llangunnor Side Road) Order 1967

The Secretary of State hereby gives notice that in relation to the above-mentioned Trunk Road at Nantycaws, Llangunnor in the county of Carmarthen, he has made under section 9 of the above Act an Order which will authorise the Secretary of State to carry out improvements to Cwmladron Road at Nantycaws aforesaid.

Any person aggrieved by the Order and desiring to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1959, or on the ground that any requirement of that Act, or of regulations made thereunder, has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may, within six weeks from 3rd February 1967, apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.

SOUTHERN RHODESIA

The Southern Rhodesia (Prohibited Trade and Dealings) Order 1967

Made - - - -	30th January 1967
Laid before Parliament	30th January 1967
Coming into Operation	31st January 1967

At the Court at Sandringham the 30th day of January 1967.

PRESENT,

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred on Her by section 2 of the Southern Rhodesia Act 1965, c. 76, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Citation, Commencement and Construction

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Southern Rhodesia (Prohibited Trade and Dealings) Order 1967, and shall come into operation on 31st January 1967.

(2) This Order and the Southern Rhodesia (Prohibited Trade and Dealings) Order 1966, S.I. 1966/1595 (1966 III, p. 5020), (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order") may be cited together as the Southern Rhodesia (Prohibited Trade and Dealings) Orders 1966 and 1967.

(3) This Order shall be construed as one with the principal Order.

Amendment of Articles 2 (6), 4 (2) and 6 (6) of the principal Order

2. Paragraph (6) of Article 2, paragraph (2) of Article 4 and paragraph (6) of Article 6 of the principal Order are amended by the deletion of the words "and is ordinarily resident in the United Kingdom" that occur in sub-paragraph (a) of each of these paragraphs.

Amendment of Southern Rhodesia (Petroleum) Order 1965.

3. Article 1 (2) of the Southern Rhodesia (Petroleum) Order 1965, S.I. 1965/2140 (1965 III, p. 6287), is amended—

(a) by the insertion, immediately after the words "the United Kingdom" in sub-paragraph (a) thereof, of the words "or the law of Southern Rhodesia";

(b) by the insertion, immediately after the words "the United Kingdom and Colonies" in sub-paragraph (b) thereof, of the words "or a British subject without citizenship" and the deletion from that sub-paragraph of the words "and is ordinarily resident in the United Kingdom"; and

(c) by the insertion, immediately after sub-paragraph (b) thereof, of the word "or" and the following new sub-paragraph as sub-paragraph (c):
