TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS

1. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England on Friday, 5th September 1969, at 1 p.m. for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, and the National Loans Act, 1968, to the amount of £150,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000, £100,000 or £250,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 8th September 1969, to Friday, 12th September 1969, inclusive, and will be due 91 days after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being a multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. Notifications will be sent, on the same day as Tenders are received, to the persons whose Tenders are accepted in whole or in part, and payments in full of the amounts due in respect of such accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash or by draft or cheque drawn on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that they have made an Order under sections 1, 2 and 13 of the Import Duties Act 1958, viz.:

The Import Duties (General) (No. 1) Order, 1969.

This Order reduces the rate of import duty on continuous filament tow for the manufacture of man-made fibres (discontinuous) produced by chemical transformation of natural organic polymers (such as cellulose, casein, proteins and algae), for example, viscose rayon, cuprammonium rayon (cupra), cellulose acetate and alginates.

The Order comes into operation on 4th September 1969, and has been published as Statutory Instruments 1969 No. 1214.

The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that they have made an Order under section 3 (6) and 13 of the Import Duties Act 1958, viz.:

The Import Duties (Temporary Exemptions) (No. 5) Order, 1969.

This Order provides that the goods listed in Schedule 1 shall be temporary exempt from import duty, and those listed in Schedule 2 shall continue to be so exempt, both until 1st January 1970, except for items for which an earlier day is specified. The goods referred to in Schedule 1 by reference to Tariff headings 29.16 and 29.39 have been re-classified under those headings following a Classification Opinion of the Customs Co-operation Council: their former headings are given in Schedule 3.

The Order comes into operation on 4th September 1969 and has been published as Statutory Instrument 1969 No. 1215.
