*The Trunk Road (Tenby Road, St. Clears)
(Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1970*

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State intends to make an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, the effect of which will be to prohibit waiting in the length of road specified in the Schedule below.

Exceptions will be provided in the Order to enable a vehicle to wait for so long as may be necessary for a person to board or alight from the vehicle; to enable goods to be loaded on to or unloaded from the vehicle; to enable the vehicle to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance of the road or the services therein or to enable the vehicle if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road to be used in the service of a local authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties.

A copy of the proposed Order together with a plan may be seen at the Divisional Surveyor's Office, Carmarthenshire County Council, Tenby Road, St. Clears.

SCHEDULE

That length of the St. Clears—Nash (South Pembrokeshire) Trunk Road (A.477), known as Tenby Road, at St. Clears in the County of Carmarthen, which extends from its junction with that length of the London—Fishguard Trunk Road (A.48), known as Blue Boar Square, to a point 213 yards south-west of that junction.
