The Import Duties (Temporary Exemptions) (No. 1) Order 1971.

This Order provides for the temporary exemption from import duty, until 4th May 1971, of certain magnesite, steel plates, and steel pipes, all as specified in the Schedule to the Order.

Town and Country Planning Acts 1962 and 1968

The Trunk Road (Llanymynech, Montgomery) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1971

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State has revoked the Trunk Road (Llanymynech, Montgomery) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1963 and has made a new Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, the effect of which is to prohibit waiting in that length of the Swansea—Manchester Trunk Road (A.483), at Llanymynech in the County of Montgomery, which lies between a point 50 yards south of its junction with Station Road and a point 147 yards north of that junction, a distance of 197 yards.

Exceptions have been provided in the Order to enable a vehicle to wait for so long as may be necessary for a person to board or alight from the vehicle, to enable goods to be unloaded on to or unloaded from the vehicle, to enable the vehicle to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance of the road or the services therein, or to enable the vehicle to be used in the service of a local authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties.

If you wish to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, or on the grounds

that any requirement of that Act or of any instrument made under it, has not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may within 6 weeks from the 6th January 1971 apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order.

The Trunk Road (Llanwrda) (One-Way Traffic) Order 1971

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for Wales intends to make an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, the effect of which will be that:

1. No person shall cause any vehicle to proceed in a south-westerly direction in that length of the Swansea—Manchester Trunk Road (A.483) at Llanwrda in the County of Carmarthen, which extends from a point 500 yards south-west of its junction with the Llanwrda—Aberayron Road (A.482) to a point 540 yards south-west of that junction.

2. No person shall cause any vehicle to proceed in a westerly direction in that length of the Swansea—Manchester Trunk Road (A.483), at Llanwrda in the County of Carmarthen, which extends from a point 163 yards east of its junction with the Llanwrda—Aberayron Road (A.482) to a point 373 yards east of that junction.
