London Electricity Board Heating Scheme 1971

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State in exercise of his powers under section 50 (3) of the Electricity Act 1947 proposes to make an Order approving the heating scheme submitted to him by the London Electricity Board set out in the Schedule hereto. The Order will also make consequential adaptations to statutory provisions relating to the breaking-up of streets, railways and tramways.
