#### TREASURY

The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that they have made an Order under sections 12 (4) and 43 (1) of the Finance Act 1972 viz: The Value Added Tax (General) (No. 1) Order 1974 imposes value added tax at the standard rate on certain food products and drinks, including:

- (a) Ice cream, ice lollies, frozen yoghurt, similar frozen products and preparations for making such products;
- (b) Chocolates, sweets, similar confectionary and chocolate biscuits;
- (c) Manufactured non-alcoholic beverages, including fruit juices and bottled waters, and products for the preparation of beverages; and cider, perry, etc., not specifically chargeable with customs or excise duty;
- (d) Potato crisps and similar products, salted and roasted nuts.

The Order also imposes value added tax at the standard rate on all hydrocarbon oils on which revenue duty at the unrebated rate (at present 22½p per gallon), has been or is to be charged, on any gas to be used as road fuel, or petrol substitutes and on power methylated spirits.
