The Trunk Road (Coracle Way, Carmarthen) (No Right-Hand Turn) (Revocation) Order 197

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State intends to make an Order under section 84D of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974, the effect of which will be to revoke the Trunk Road (Coracle Way, Carmarthen) (No Right-Hand Turn) Order 1970, which prohibited vehicles travelling in a westerly direction along Coracle Way from making a right-hand turn into Little Bridge Street.

The one-way traffic system now operating along Coracle

The one-way traffic system now operating along Coracle Way precludes the possibility of traffic turning right into Little Bridge Street, so the existing Order prohibiting this movement is no longer necessary and should be revoked.

NOTICE OF SEIZURE UNDER THE CUSTOMS AND EXCISE ACT 1952

Pursuant to section 275 (5) of the Customs and Excise Act 1952 and paragraph 1 of the 7th Schedule thereto, the Commissioners of Customs and Excise hereby give you notice that by virtue of the powers contained in the Customs and Excise Acts and enactments amending those Acts, certain goods, namely 21 (No) diamonds taken from you and detained by Customs Officers on the 30th day of September 1975 at London Airport (Heathrow) have been seized as liable to forfeiture upon the grounds that on the 30th day of September 1975 Seeger you were a person entering the United Kingdom and the said goods were not declared by you as required by section 6 (1) of the Finance Act 1968.

to the junction of that road with that bus lane; or (b) from any part of Uxbridge Road, West Ealing, which does not comprise that bus lane through any gap in the longitudinal single white line if that vehicle forthwith enters the road which lies

opposite that gap; or

(c) from any vehicular accessway or carriage crossing over the footway adjoining that bus lane if that vehicle forthwith leaves that bus lane at a point opposite that vehicular accessway or carriage crossing; or

(2) in the lengths of road specified in Schedule 3

Notice is hereby given that on the application of the Council of the London Borough of Lambeth, the Greater London Council on 18th February 1976 made:

(a) the Lambeth (Parking Places) (No. 1) Order 1976 under sections 35, 36, 37 and 40 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by the Transport Act 1968;
(b) the Lambeth (Free Parking Places) (No. 1) Order 1976 under section 6 of the above-mentioned Act of 1967, as amended by the Transport Act 1968 and the Road Traffic Act 1974; and

(c) the Lambeth (Waiting and Loading Restriction) (Amendment No. 22) Order 1976 and the Lambeth (Prescribed Routes) (No. 3) Traffic Order 1976 under sections 6 and 84D of the above-mentioned Act of 1967 as amended by the abovementioned Acts of 1968 and 1974.

Hereinafter in this notice the above-mentioned Orders are referred to respectively as "the Parking Places Order", "the Free Parking Places Order", "the Waiting and Loading Restriction Order" and "the Prescribed Routes Order".

- 2. The general effect of the Orders will be to impose a system of controlled parking in the Brixton Area of the London Borough of Lambeth comprising the streets and parts of the streets listed in the Schedules to this notice (hereinafter referred to as "the controlled area").
 - 3. The Parking Places Order:
 - (a) designates parking places on the highways specified in column 1 of Schedule 2 to this notice at which charges may be made by the Borough Council for vehicles authorised by the Order to be left in those parking places and provides that the type of parking place so designated will be as set out in column 2 of that Schedule;

- (c) specifies, in respect of metered parking places, that passenger vehicles (12 seats or less), goods carrying vehicles, motor cycles and invalid carriages may be left therein and, in respect of resident's parking places that vehicles displaying a vehicle and invalid carriages may be left therein and, in respect of resident's parking places that vehicles displaying a vehicle and in respect of resident's parking places. valid permit in a protective cover issued by the Borough Council may be left therein;
- (d) provides that permits, protective covers and season tickets will be issued by the Borough Council on application being made by any person residing in the controlled area who is the owner of a passenger vehicle (12 seats or less), a goods carrying vehicle not more than 7 feet 6 inches in height, a motor cycle or an invalid carriage;

(e) specifies that:

(i) in the metered, 2-hour parking places, the initial charge will be at the rate of 5 new pence for 1 hour (maximum initial period 2 hours);

(ii) in the metered, 4-hour parking places, the initial charge will be at the rate of 10 new pence for two hours (maximum initial period 4 hours);

- (iii) in the residents' parking places the charge for season tickets will be 50p, £1.50 and £3 for tickets expiring at the end of one month, three months and six months respectively running from the beginning of the month for which they are issued;
- (iv) in respect of the metered, 2-hour and metered, 4-hour parking places the excess charge-Council—will be 50p and £1 respectively; the excess charge period will be one hour and two hours respectively; the unexpired time shown on the parking meter may be used free of charge; and the period during which a vehicle may not return to a parking place will be 1 hour;
- (f) provides that certain vehicles may wait free of charge in certain circumstances, e.g., to allow persons to board or alight (maximum 2 minutes), to load or unload (maximum 20 minutes) and vehicles left by specified disabled persons (no time limit).

4. The Free Parking Places Order:

(a) designates parking places on the streets specified in Schedule 3 to this notice in which vehicles authorised by the Order may be left for any period without charge;
(b) provides that the parking places will operate between 8.30 a.m. and 5.30 p.m. on Saturdays (Christmas Day and Bank Holidays excepted);

(c) specifies that only vehicles displaying a valid permit in a protective cover issued by or on behalf of the GreaterLondon Council may be left in the parking places; (See Note 2 below).

(d) contains similar provisions to those set out in paragraphs 3(c), (d) and (f) above except that it makes no reference to

- 5. The Waiting and Loading Restriction Order further amends the Lambeth (Waiting and Loading Restriction) Order 1973, so that, except in designated parking places:
 - (a) waiting by vehicles (otherwise than for the purpose of delivering or collecting goods or loading or unloading a vehicle) will be prohibited:
 - (i) at any time of the day or night throughout the week in certain lengths of streets specified in Schedule 4 to this notice:
 - (ii) between 8 a.m. and 6.30 on Mondays to Saturdays inclusive in certain lengths of streets specified in Schedule 5 to this notice;
 - (iii) between 8.30 a.m. and 5.30 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays inclusive in certain streets and certain lengths of streets specified in Schedule 6 to this notice; (iv) between 8.30 a.m. and 5.30 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays inclusive in certain streets and certain lengths of streets
 - specified in Schedule 7 to this notice;
 - (b) waiting by vehicles for the purpose of delivering or collecting goods or loading or unloading a vehicle will be prohibited:
 (i) between 8 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays inclusive in certain lengths of streets specified in Schedule
 - 4 to this noitice;
 (ii) between 8 a.m. and 9.30 a.m. and between 4.30 p.m. and 6.30 p.m. on Mondays to Satrudays inclusive in certain

lengths of streets specified in Schedule 8 to this notice;
(iii) unless otherwise prohibited, for a period of more than 20 minutes in the same place:

- (1) between 11 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. throughout the week in certain lengths of streets specified in Schedule 4 to this notice;
- (2) between 11 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays inclusive in certain lengths of streets specified in Schedule 5 to this notice
- (3) between 11 a.m. and 5.30 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays inclusive in certain streets and lengths of streets
- specified in Schedule 6 to this notice;
 (4) between 11 a.m. and 5.30 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays inclusive in certain streets and lengths of streets specified in Schedule 7 to this notice;
- (c) the sale or offer for sale of goods from a vehicle in the streets and lengths of streets referred to in sub-paragraph (a) above will be prohibited except on a Sunday, unless there is in force a valid licence issued by the Lambeth Borough Council or the goods are immediately taken into or delivered at premises adjacent to the vehicle from which the sale is effected;
