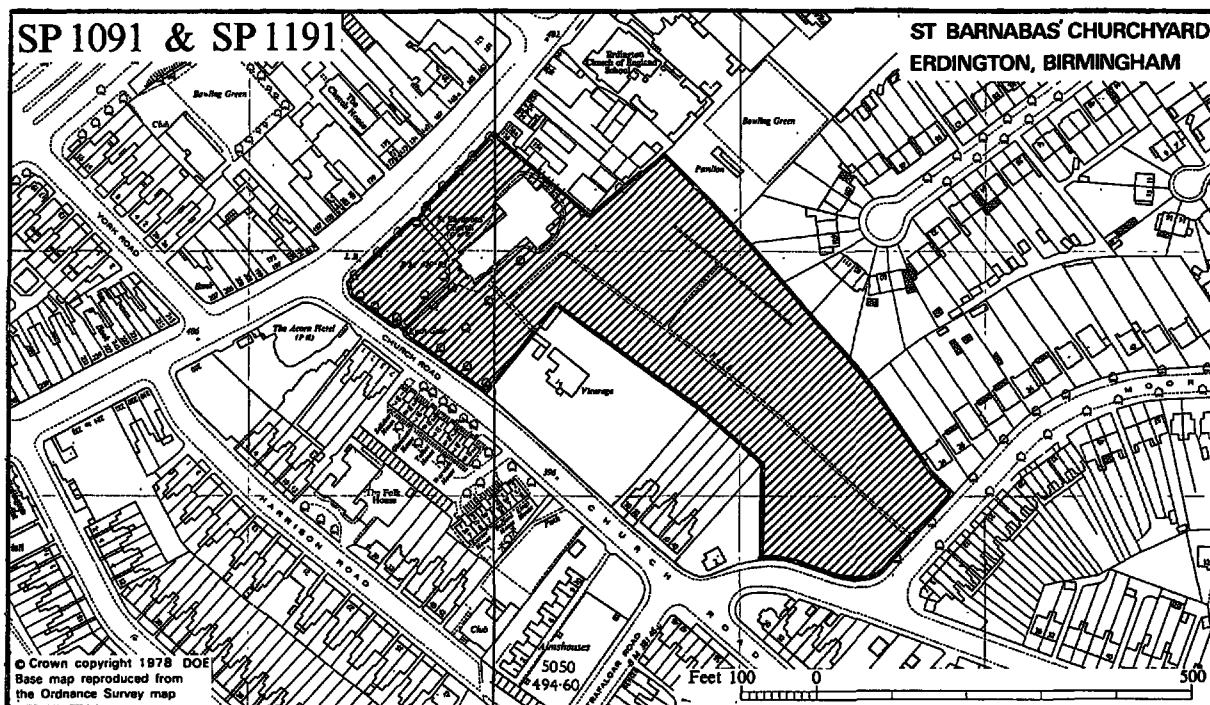


The Plan referred to in the foregoing Order in Council



At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 6th day of February 1979

PRESENT,

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Whereas by the Suffragans Nomination Act 1888 it is enacted that from and after the passing of that Act for the purposes of the Act of the 26th year of the reign of King Henry the Eighth, Chapter 14, intituled "An Act for Nomination and Consecration of Suffragans within this Realm," such other Towns as Her Majesty The Queen may from time to time by Order in Council direct shall be taken and accepted for Sees of Bishops Suffragans as if they had been included in that Act, and that that Act shall be construed and have effect accordingly:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, under and by virtue of the powers vested in Her by the said recited Act, and all other powers enabling Her in that behalf, and by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to direct, and doth hereby direct, that the Town of which the name is scheduled to this Order shall be taken and accepted for a See of a Bishop Suffragan as if it had been included in the above-mentioned Act of the 26th year of the reign of King Henry the Eighth, Chapter 14.
