(d) to a vehicle waiting for not more than 2 minutes to enable a person to board or alight or to load or unload his personal baggage. The limit of 2 minutes will not apply if the person has serious difficulty in walking or is blind; or

(e) where the person in control of the vehicle is required by law to stop or does so in order to avoid an accident.

5. The prohibition and requirements referred to in paragraph 2 above will not apply in respect of anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police constable in uniform.

6.
