E have receiv'd Letters from Barcelona, dated the second Instant, by which we Argyle was fet out from thence to Tarragona, in order to review the English Forces, and give the necessary Directions for their Encamping. The Duke de Vendome being inform'd that Marefehal Staremberg was taking the Field, and that his Catholick Majefty had rejoiv'd to put himfelf at the Head of the Confederate Troops; Orders were thereupon given for Forming the Enemies Army: But all Accounts agree, that they are in no Condition to attempt any thing this Campaign; and that there-fore their Intentions are only to keep themselves on the Desensive. The Army of the Allies is said to confist of more than Thirty thousand Men, be-sides a strong Eody of Miquelets. The French feem apprehensive, that Endeavours will be made to destroy their Magazines at Cervera; and the Forwardness of the Confederates gives them much Uneafiness on that account. Some Frigats belonging to the Allies, lately engaged with two French Ships, richly laden, and bound from Smyrra to Marfeilles, one of which they have taken; and after they had forc'd the other ashore, they took out

her most valuable Effects, and then burnt her.

Berlin, August 25. N. S. On the Twenty first Instant the King of Prussa arriv'd at Potsdam, where he was received by Her Majesty and the whole Court.
