**H**ere are Letters from Vice Chancellor Schaphiroff dated from Adrianople the Twentieth seventh of November, giving Advice, that the King of Sweden was still at Bender, being unwilling to leave the Turkish Territories; but that the said Vice-Chancellor was going to Constantinople, in hopes to prevail with the Sultan to hasten the departure of his Suedish Majesty; and that he had receiv'd Assurances of its being accomplish'd, as soon as Afoph, and the adjacent Forts, were evacuated and deliver'd up to the Turkish Forces; and after that Schaphiroff himself in expectation of returning homewards. Here has been great Feasting, Bonfires, and discharge of Artillery, for several Days together, upon the account of the Marriage of the Hereditary Prince of Muscovy with the Princess Charlotte Sophia, Daughter of Duke Lewis of Wolfenbittel and Grand-daughter of the Duke Regent of Wolfenbittel, and Sister to the Emperor now reign'g.

*Hamburg, Jan. 19. N. S.* Our last Letters from Pomerania, which came hither on the Fifteenth, say, that the Town of Rostock would be charg'd this Winter with the Maintaining of Three thousand Danes, and a Magazine would be establish'd there for the Subsistence of the Troops which are to remain in Mecklenburg; and, that the King of Poland had demanded an Hundred and fifty thousand Crowns from the Towns of Ancklam and Gripwald. But the Baron de Kniphauer, in the Name of his Master the King of Prussia, had made pressing Instances to the King of Denmark, that he would not take up his Winter-Quarters in those Countries. Upon the Nineteenth of this Month, the two Kings of Denmark and Poland took their Leave of each other, and the former was on his Journey to Gutfrow. Four thousand Men are to remain before Wismar, and the rest are to take their Quarters in Holstein. The Pass of Dan garten has been demolish'd by Order of the King of Denmark; and all the Bridges broken down between that and Tribbefes. We have since had fresher Advices, that the Army of the King of Denmark encamp'd the Tenth of this Instant at Schwain, within three Leagues of Rostock; and upon the Sixteenth it was expected near Wismar, from whence they are to pursue their March to Holstein; and, according to the Disposition of them that is said to be already made, the Foot are to have their Winter Quarters from Rendesbourg to the Lesser Belt. The Ministers of Great Britain, Holland, Prussia, and Hanover, upon the Fifteenth were arriv'd at Gutfrow, where his Danish Majesty was expected the next day, from whence he was to proceed to Sverin, and thence to Rendesbourg; but it was not yet resolv'd whether his Majesty would reside this Winter at Coldinguen, or would pass over to Copenhagen. The Ambassador of the Czar of Muscovy has assur'd the King of Denmark that his Master will, in a little time, pay him the Sum of Eight hundred thousand Roubles, and that he would advance more Money towards refitting the Danish Fleet, so that it might be in a readiness to Act very early the next Campaign. They write from Gutf-

strow, that fifteen Transport Vessels loaden with Men and Ammunition of War, were lately arriv'd at Wismar, from the Isle of Rugen. The Elector of Hannover has given Permission for all Sorts of Merchandises to be carried from hence into his Dominions; and the same has been rotify'd to the Senate by his Minister.

*From the Danish Camp before Schwain, Jan. 13. N. S.* The Danish and Saxon Army decamp'd from before Stralsund upon the Seventh of this Month, and March'd in several Columns, after having burnt their Baracks and Forage which gave Occasion to the Town about an Hour afterwards, to make a Sally with the greatest part of their Cavalry, and fall upon their Rear; but finding that all things were rightly disposed, they retir'd back after some light Skirmishes. The Army encamp'd that Night near Reinichen, within two Leagues of Stralsund, where the Saxon and Muscovite Troops separated themselves from the Danish Army, which pursued its March, and came upon the Twelfth, within two Leagues of Rostock, where it will remain until the Fifteenth Instant. The Saxon and Muscovite Troops continue in their Posts about Stralsund, and it is said, they design to keep them all this Winter.

*Berlin, January 16. N. S.* The King of Poland pass'd by this Place on Thursday last Incognito, with Count Lagnaico; but has left General Fleming behind him whom he lately promoted to the Dignity of Velt Marshal: This General has had frequent Conferences with Monsieur Kamke, his Prussian Majesty's Privy Counsellor, concerning the Subsistence of the Saxon and Muscovite Troops which remain in Pomerania.

*Hanover, January 19. N. S.* The King of Denmark has sent a Colonel hither, to request a Passage for his Army through the Country of Saxe Lawenburg; which was granted by his Electoral Highness; and the Colonel is gone hence with Orders for the Danish Army that were to be Quarter'd in Holstein, Jutland, and other Places belonging to the King of Denmark's Territories.

*Hague, Jan. 26. N. S.* The latest Advices from Constantinople import, that a Divan had been assembled there, to consider what was most proper to be done in favour of his Suedish Majesty: They likewise add, that upon the Twenty-fourth of November last, Mehemet Bacha, the Grand Vizir, was Depos'd at Adrianople, and was afterwards carried Prisoner to the Seven Towers. Monsieur de Mourmont, one of the Plenipotentiaries of the States who was chosen by the Province of Friseland, is at present very much indisposed, which has hinder'd his intended Journey for Utrecht. Count Singerling, who is arriv'd here, being nominated as the third Plenipotentiary to assist on the part of the Emperor, at the General Treaty of Peace, being upon the Road hither, receiv'd an Express from the Emperor, with a Relation of the Raising the Siege of Cardona, and the Advantage which the Troops of the Allies had over the Enemy, which is agreeable, in all Particulars, with the Accounts that have been heretofore given of that Action.
