*Altering the Proclamation of the 11th February 1983
Determining the Design for the One Pound Silver Coin*

Whereas under section 3 (1) (b) and (h) of the Coinage Act 1971 We have power, with the advice of Our Privy Council, by Proclamation to determine the design of any coin to be

made at Our Mint and to alter any Proclamation previously made under the said section

And Whereas by Our Proclamation dated the eleventh day of February 1983 We ordered that new coins of silver of the denomination of one pound should be made at Our Mint

And Whereas it appears to Us desirable to determine new designs for the said one pound coins

We, therefore, in pursuance of the said section 3 (1) (b) and (h) and of all other powers enabling Us in that behalf
