SOUTH YORKSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL

The South Yorkshire County Council (Various Roads, Bramley and Wickersley) (Traffic Measures Consolidation) Order 1980 (Amendment No. 4) Order 1986.

Notice is hereby given that on 26th February 1986 the South Yorkshire County Council made an Order under the provisions of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

The effect of the Order which will come into operation on 19th March 1986, will be to include the following item in Schedule 1 viz (no waiting at any time) of the Principal Order:

The Grove (Wickersley), both sides, from its junction with Bawtry Road Service Road for a distance of 15 metres in a north-westerly direction.

Bawtry Road Service Road (Wickersley), north side, from a point 15 metres west of the western kerb-line of The Grove to a point 18 metres east of the eastern kerb-line of The Grove.

Exceptions to the Order will permit waiting for the purpose of picking up and setting down passengers, loading and unloading goods, in connection with building, industrial or demolition operations, the removal of obstructions to traffic, the maintenance of the roads and the services therein, in pursuance of statutory powers or duties and for the collection and delivery of postal packets. SOUTH YORKSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL

The South Yorkshire County Council (Various Roads, Rotherham) (Traffic Measures Consolidation) Order 1985 (Amendment No. 2) Order 1986.

LONDON BOROUGH OF BRENT

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING GENERAL DEVELOPMENT ORDER 1977

Mapesbury Conservation Area N.W.2

Notice is hereby given that whereas:

- (1) The Council of the London Borough of Brent (hereinafter called "the Council") is the Local Planning Authority for the purposes of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971, as amended.
- (2) The Council is satisfied that it is expedient that development of the descriptions set out in the Schedule 2 hereto should not be carried out in the Mapesbury Conservation Area, London N.W.2, specified in Schedule 1 hereto, unless permission therefore is granted on application made under the Town and Country Planning General Development Order 1977.

Now therefore the Council in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by Article 4 of the Town and Country Planning General Development Order 1977 hereby direct that the permission granted by Article 3 of the said Order shall not apply to development in the Mapesbury Conservation Area, London N.W.2, of the descriptions set out in Schedule 2 hereto.

This direction is made in pursuance of the provisions of paragraph (3) (b) of the said Article 4 and shall remain in force until 28th August 1986 (being 6 months from the date of this direction) and will then expire unless it has been approved by the Secretary of State for the Environment before that date.
