#### CERTIFICATES OF TAX DEPOSITS (SERIES 6)

On and after 29th May 1987, the rates of interest applicable to deposits accepted under the Prospectus (Series 6) dated 11th October 1982 will be as follows:

(a) for deposits of £100,000 or over:

Held for	Applied in settlement of a scheduled liability	Withdrawn for cash
under 1 month	8 per cent	5 per cent
1 but less than 3 months	8½ per cent	5 per cent
3 but less than 6 months	8¾ per cent	5 per cent
6 but less than 9 months	8¾ per cent	5 per cent
9 to 12 months	8¾ per cent	5 per cent
in the relevant year of the interest period	9 per cent	5 per cent

(b) for deposits of less than 100,000: 8 per cent if the deposit is applied in payment of a scheduled liability and 5 per cent if the deposit is withdrawn for cash.

#### TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that he has made an Order under section 209 of the above Act entitled "The Stopping Up of Highways (County of Oxfordshire) (No. 4) Order 1987", authorising the stopping up of highway land adjacent to Evans Stores, High Street, Hook Norton in the County of Oxfordshire.

Any person aggrieved by the Order and desiring to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the ground that it is not within the power of the above Act or that any requirement of that Act or of any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may, within 6 weeks of 4th June 1987, apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.
