### PRIVY COUNCIL OFFICE

#### UNIVERSITIES OF OXFORD AND CAMBRIDGE ACT 1923

Statutes made by the Governing Body of Trinity College, in the University of Cambridge on 26th May 1987, amending Statutes XXII, LI.1, LVII, LXI, LXII, LI.2, and XLI, has been submitted for the approval of Her Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act 1923.

The purpose of the amendments is to discontinue closed entrance exhibitions for persons educated at specified schools; make flexible the limit on donations made by the College Council; and repeal an obsolete provision regarding the admission of women. (9 SI)

#### MISUSE OF DRUGS ACT 1971, SECTIONS 13 AND 15

*Extension of temporary direction withdrawing certain powers in relation to controlled drugs*

In accordance with section 16(2) of the Misuse of Drugs Act 1971, notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State has, in accordance with section 15(6) of that Act, further extended the period of operation of the following direction given in accordance with section 13 of that Act, which took effect on 5th December 1986 and was extended on 16th January, 13th February, 13th March, 10th April and 8th May 1987 for a period of 28 days commencing on 5th June 1987:

"The Secretary of State, in pursuance of subsection (2) of section 13, and by virtue of section 15, of the Misuse of Drugs Act 1971, by this Direction prohibits Dr. Alan George Walker, M.B., Ch.B., a doctor within the meaning of that Act, whose registered address is 44 Brighton Road, South Croydon, Surrey, from prescribing, administering and supplying and from authorising the administration and supply of any controlled drug within the meaning of that Act, which was on 28th October 1986 such a controlled drug, save and except the following:

- (a) Dextromoramide.
- (b) Any substance and products specified on Schedule 4 to the Misuse of Drugs Regulations 1985.
- (c) Any preparation specified in Schedule 5 to the Misuse of Drugs Regulations 1985, other than such a preparation containing Dihydrocodeine."
