Notice is hereby given that the Macclesfield Borough Council acting pursuant to arrangements made with Cheshire County Council in accordance with section 101 of the Local Government Act 1972 propose to make the above Orders in accordance with the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

The effect of the Orders would be as follows:

1) Borough of Macclesfield (Street Parking Controlled Zone Macclesfield) (Variation No. 3) Order

To delete the parking bay adjacent to 89 Churchill Way and prohibit waiting at any time on both sides of the access and egress roads to the Multi Storey Car Park.

2) Borough of Macclesfield (Statham Street (Part) Macclesfield) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order

To prohibit waiting at any time on both sides of Statham Street south-west of its junction with Paradise Street for a distance of 30 metres including the proposed cul-de-sac end.

3) Borough of Macclesfield (Paradise Street/Crossall Street Junction and Statham Street Macclesfield) (Prohibition of Through Traffic) Order

To prohibit through traffic from using the Paradise Street/ Crossall Street junction and through traffic from using Statham Street between its junctions with Paradise Street and St. Johns Road. It is intended that a physical barrier will be provided at the Paradise Street/Crossall Street junction in such a position to link the residential lengths of the two streets and separately link the industrial/commercial lengths of the two streets. It is intended that Statham Street would be closed to through traffic by the provision of a physical barrier north-east of No. 28.

4) Borough of Macclesfield (Colville Road, Springfield Road and Merebrook Road Macclesfield) (Prohibition of Through Traffic) Order

To prohibit through traffic from travelling from Chester Road to Earlsway via Colville Road, Springfield Road and Merebrook Road. It is proposed that a physical barrier should be provided on Springfield Road between its junction with Colville Road and Merebrook Road.

5) Borough of Macclesfield (Pearl Street Prestbury) (Prohibition of Right turn) Order

To prohibit any vehicle turning right from Pearl Street into New Road (A538) Prestbury.

6) Borough of Macclesfield (Gravel Lane (Part) Wilmslow) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order

To prohibit waiting at any time on the south side of Gravel Lane from its southerly junction with Knutsford Road for a distance of 43 metres in a westerly direction.

7) Borough of Macclesfield (A538 Altrincham Road (Part) Wilmslow) (Derestriction) Order

To remove the 30 m.p.h. speed restriction that would become operative by virtue of the provision of street lighting on the length of Altrincham Road from a point 60 metres north of its junction with Mobberley Road to a point 265 metres east of its junction with Altrincham Road.

Exemptions in respect of Orders 1, 2 and 6 will include in respect of the loading and unloading of goods, the supply of gas water and electricity and disabled drivers vehicles.
