Stockbolm, July 13. N. S.

HE Circular Letters for Summoning the States of the Kingdom to meet here, are not yet fent to the feveral Provinces, and it is now believ'd that Defign will be wholly laid afide. Some Days ago the Senate came to a Refolution to impose a general Poll-Tax, to be paid in Two Months, by which they propose to raise a Sum of above Five hundred thousand Crowns. A Squadron of Seven or Eight Men of War is fitting out, in order to convoy fome Transport-Ships that are lading with Provisions and Ammunition for the Garrifons of Stralfund and Wifmar. That of Stetin is thought to be already provided for Four Months. The Senate have lately receiv'd an Express from General Meyerfeldt, Governor of shat Place, &cquainting them with fome Propofals that had been made to him for giving it up to the King of Pruffia. To which he had return'd answer, That the King his Mafter having placed fo great Confidence in him, as to entrust him with the Government of a Town of fuch Importance, he would fuffer himfelf to be reduced to the laft Extremity, before he would Surrender it to any other Power, without an exprefs Order under his Majefty's own Hand. The Senate fent him word by the fame Express, That they approve of his Conduct extremely, and applaud his Zeal for the King's Service, affuring him that in cafe he fhould be attack'd, they will employ their utmost Endeavours to succettr him. The last Letters from Finland bring an account, that the Muscovites were advanced na further than Borgo, and the Swedes lay observing them at Holfing Rat. Our Squattron there hath been lately' teinforced by Four Men of War of Fifty Guns each, and we now think our felves fecure at Sea. But as we have receiv'd Intelligence that the Czar is still making great Preparations at Wybourg, and Petersbourg, and leveral Regiments of Horie have lately join'd his Army at Borgo, we are in fome pain for our Land Forces, which confact of no more than Seven thoufand Men, whereas those of the Enemy are faid to

amount at least to Twenty thousand. Warsaw, July 26. N. S. We have received Advice from Petersbourg, that the Czar intended to fet out from thence in a few Days with a confide-table Number of Troops, in order to make an entire Conquest of Finland. Letters from our Ambaffador at the Ottoman Port bring an Account, that on the 24th paft a Treaty of Peace was con-cluded between the Turks and Muscovites, upon which great Rejoicings had been made at Adrianople, and Sixty Days were allow'd for the Czar's Ratification. Nothing having been flipulated for the King of Sweden, it was believed his Majeily would go by Sea to Marfeilles, when he found no Nothing having been flipulated for reason to hope for Assistance from the Grand Signior ; but he had not declar'd what Refolution he bereby directed, That no Payment shall be made upon any

March through the Milanese towards Germany: The Catalans continue Obstinate in their Resolution to refit his Catholick Majefty, against whom they have declared War, as they have likewife done against France; and it is faid they have already formed a Body of Five thousand Horse. The Duke of Savoy having received the Treaty with Spain, by which Sicily is to be delivered to him, intends, wishin a Month, to embark on Board Her Majelty's Ships with a fufficient Number of Iroops

to take Poffelion of that Kingdom. Berlin, August 5. N. S. The Ministers of the Northern Princes have been very Importunate with his Majelty to engage in the War, and it is faid he refolves to continue at Potldam fome time longer than he had at first intended, to avoid the preiling Instances they make hint. Count Schon-born is lately arrived here with a Commillion from the Emperor, relating to those Affairs. Frince Menzikoff went from hence fome Days ago, in Prince order to return from Pomerania, where the Mulcovite Troops are to Quarter next Winter. They have taken Possellion of the Isle of Rugen, and have block'd up Stralfund and Stetin, but they have not yet made any formal Attack upon them, for want of Artillery and Ammunition.

The Comptrollers by themfelves, or their Clerks before-mentioned respectively, shall at least once in every Twenty eight Days, to be reckoned from the Date bere-of, visit the Cash of each of the faid Paymasters, and by numbring the Bags, opening them or fome of them promiscuously, and if be thinks it necessary by weighing or telling the Money, or any part thereof, shall see that the said respective Paymasters bave in real Money, or in fuch Bills as by Law may pass through the Exchequer, the Remains wherewith the faid Comptrollers charge them respettively.

X. The faid respective Paymasters are hereby required to Account Yearly, according to the Course of the Ex-chequer, or ofiner if thereunto required, for all the Moneys they shall receive and pay in the respettive

Offices; and if any of their Payments (to be compre-bended in the faid Accompts) shall be made in Exchequer Bills, the Interest incurring thereupon from the respective Times of illuing the faid Bills at the Exche-quer, till the respective Times on which they shall be paid away in the respective Offices of the said Paymasters; (hall be Surcharged in the faid Accompts, upon the Oaths of the Accomptants.

XI. That thefe Orders be publickly Affixed in the re-Speltive Offices.
