5. The Order provides that in pursuance of section 10(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the Borough Engineer, or some person authorised in that behalf by him, may, if it appears to him or that person essential in the interests of the expeditious, convenient and safe movement of traffic or for preserving or improving the amenities of the area through which any road affected by the Order runs, modify or suspend the Order or any provision thereof.
