The New Towns of Warrington and Runcorn: Extinguishment of Public Rights of Way Birchwood Boulevard, Warrington

Description of Rights of Way

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for the Environment, in exercise of his powers under section 23 of the New Towns Act 1981, proposes to make an Order extinguishing the Public Rights of Way over the following route shown coloured red on the map herein referred to:

That length of the public footpath at Birchwood Boulevard, Warrington, starting from the points marked A1 and A2 on the map, which abut Oakwood Gate Park, and running in a southeasterly direction for a distance of 182 metres or thereabouts to the point marked B on the map which is located approximately 56 metres south-east of the most northerly point of the cul-desac of the road known as Birchwood Boulevard.

A map showing the rights of way proposed to be extinguished may be inspected at the offices of the Warrington and Runcorn Development Corporation, New Town House, Buttermarket Street, Warrington WA1 2LF, during normal office hours.
