

OADBY AND WIGSTON BOROUGH COUNCIL

The Borough of Oadby and Wigston (Off-street Parking Places) (Amendment No. 1) Order 1989

Notice is hereby given that the Oadby and Wigston Borough Council in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by Section 35 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, and of all other enabling powers and with the consent of the Leicestershire County Council given under Section 39(3) of the Act, propose to make an Order amending the Borough of Oadby and Wigston (Off-street Parking Places, Oadby and Wigston) Order 1976.

The effect of the Order will be twofold:

- (1) To permit vehicles or vehicle combinations over 30 cwt to park on spaces at East Street Car Park, Oadby (north-eastern corner) except between 7 a.m. and 7 p.m., Monday to Saturday inclusive, as opposed to the existing Order provision which allows parking at any time, subject to a 72 hour maximum stay.
- (2) To extend the existing Order in the following terms to include the off-street parking place recently provided at Aylestone Lane, Wigston:

The existing Order specifies other provisions and conditions under which the car parks may be used. Full details are contained in the existing Order which, together with the amended Order and a statement of the Council's reasons for proposing to make the Order, may be inspected at the Council Offices, Station Road, Wigston, during normal office hours and at the Public Library, Sandhurst Street, Oadby, during Library opening hours.
